




It is truly a magnificent achievement that the Group has been part of the Community of Rabat and help to form the character of thousands of boys and girls. Since the last celebration of the Group's founding, a new Headquarters has been set up in a custom designed building in the central part of Rabat. This has enabled the increase in the frequency and quality of the Group's activities.

Scouting is still based on the same moral principle of over 100 years ago. The discipline and the pledge to do one's best to help others and establish harmonious relations are the Scout law. Scouting builds character and nurtures the young to be independent whilst acquiring the skills of a leader by connecting with others in a way that is relevant and attractive

These Centenary celebrations are also an opportunity to also look ahead and to continue adapting to the changing social landscape and to remain relevant to maintain a positive contribution to the new generations of youth in Rabat.







Message from the Chief Commissioner

Celebrating the centenary of Scouting in Rabat is no small feat.

This shows that throughout all these years, the Group painstakingly followed the Principles and Methods of the Scout Movement as laid down by our founder Lord Baden Powell. This also shows the great dedication and determination of both past and present Leaders.

As with any other Scout Group on the Island, the Group has passed through different experiences, some good and some perhaps not so positive, however the Group has learnt how to persevere and work hard to achieve! This is seen in the balanced number of Group members and Leaders and the personal progress achieved by each member in the Personal Progressive Training Scheme within the respective Sections.

A mammoth success was achieved by the Group with the building of their own Headquarters following numerous years of chasing around Rabat in search of a place its members could call their own Headquarters. Following a bold decision by the Leaders, it was determined that the Group would embark on a massive project and build their own Headquarters. Numerous and lengthy negotiations took place and in 2006 the Group managed to lease a plot of land. In the record time of six months, lots of hard work and endless fund-raising activities by Leaders and supporters of the Group, the 1st Rabat Scout Group moved into their new Scout Headquarters.

In the past decade, members of the 1st Rabat Scout Group have consistently participated at all Sectional Events organised at District and National level.

Participation at International Scouting events is something worth mentioning too.



These include:

- World Jamborees: Chile (1999), Centenary UK (2007) and Sweden (2011);
- Euro Jamboree UK (2005);
- Roverway: Portugal (2003), Italy(2006), Iceland (2009) and Finland (2012).



Participation at such events shows that the Group has also widened its horizons and as a result continues to sustain a good perception of Scouting, both on a local level as well as internationally.

Before concluding, I would also like to mention that apart from their hectic roles as Leaders within the Group, most of the Leaders work voluntarily and contribute towards the upkeep of the Għajn Tuffieħa Scout Campsite.

There have been numerous youths from Rabat and its environs who have received a Scouting education in the past 100 years. Many of these youths have grown up into exemplary citizens within our society and this is thanks to the dedication and help of their Adult Leaders.

I would like to take this opportunity to encourage the young members of Rabat Scout Group to follow in the footsteps of their past and present Leaders. When the time comes look forward and take up the leadership of the Group to keep the great legacy, the 1st Rabat Scout Group, going!

The BAND of the 1st Rabat Scout Group

- 1933 The first Scout Band at Rabat was formed at this time when the Royal Malta Artillery Regiment stationed at Mtarfa donated two tenor drums, one base drum and four bugles.
- 1946 Further band instruments were donated by the South Lancashire Regiment stationed at Mtarfa. The band now consisted of four tenor drums, one base drum, six bugles, cymbals and six fifes. The Regiment also provided tuition for band members.
- 1982 The Scout Band was reformed and new band instruments purchased.
- 2013 On the occassion of its 100th. Anniversary, the 1st Rabat Scout Group has reformed its Corp of Drums with the purchase of three new tenor drums. The highlight of this reform is the introduction of Bagpipes, a first in the Group's history.






History of the 1st Rabat Scout Group



As a member of the Scout Association of Malta, the 1st Rabat Scout Group is a member of the Central District, which is a modern amalgamation of three older districts, namely the Acorn, the Aardwolf and the Griffin.



The 1st Rabat Scout Group holds regular weekly meetings for its Sections and also organises several outdoor activities like hikes, camping and joint activities with other Groups, throughout the year.

It is the aim of the 1st Rabat Scout Group to live up to the Scout Motto 'BE PREPARED' as did our predecessors over the decades since its founding.



Time line of the 1st Rabat Scout Group

• 1913 On the 30th September the Group was registered as part of the Overseas Branch of The Boy Scouts Association. This was soon after scouting in Malta was registered with the Imperial Headquarters. Mr. W. H. Alton





was the first Scoutmaster and meetings were held outside his residence in College Street. Some time later the meetings were being held in a garage in St. Mary Street. The first Camping was held at Gomerino, limits of Rabat.

- 1918 Rabat Group was amongst the Troops that took part in the Armistice Celbrations soon after regrouping and after losing most of its leaders due to the war effort. Mr. Louis Ebeier was in charge of the Group at The Government this time. Elementary School for Bovs was being used as Headquarters. At about this time, the Notabile Scout Group was formed (16th June), however this soon became dormant, never to be revived.
- 1920 Mr. Dominic Gruppetta was Scoutmaster at this time. The earliest known Group photo was taken during this year in St. Dominic Square, Rabat. When Mr Gruppetta eventually left to join the Hamrun Scout Group, Rabat Group became dormant.

- 1932 Mr. R. W. Hubback re-opened the Group using the Government Elementary School for Girls as Group Headquarters.
- 1934 Mr. Tommy Vella was in charge of the Group in 1934. The Headquarters moved to St. Pius V Street, Rabat.
- 1936 A g a i n t h e Headquarters was moved to a new location, this time in Cosmana Navarra Street, Rabat. The Scoutmaster in charge of the Group was Mr. Joseph Vella.
- 1939 The outbreak of World War II found the Group being led by Mr. Peter J. Micallef. The Scouts performed various duties in the community and the Headquarters was given up to house refugees' safely in Rabat. Due to lack of adult leaders, who were otherwise absorbed in the war effort, the Group became dormant.
- 1943 Rabat Troop attended the presentation of the Bronze Cross awarded collectively to the Scouts of Malta during St. George's Day at Palace Square (now Pjazza San Ġorġ) Valletta.







- 1944 Mr. A. Giordimaina reorganised the Group and the Headquarters at Saqqajja Hill was used for the first time. The premises are still used for scouting purposes to the present day.
- 1947 The Group participated in the 11th World Scout Jamboree in Moisson, France, the first post war Jamboree, and daubed the Jamboree of Peace. In this and the subsequent year Scouters from Rabat and St. Julians Groups helped set up a new group at Mtarfa for Maltese and British Boys.









- 1949 Mr. Anthony Micallef took charge as Scoutmaster of the Group.
- 1953 Four representatives the Rabat Group were amongst the 53 Scouts from Malta who attend the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in London. In this same year the Overseas Travelling Commissioner from the Scout Imperial Headquarters praised Rabat Group, amongst another few, and noted that it was "a good little Group".
- 1954 In 1955 the Rabat Group won the 'Mallia Shield', an award based on camping standards and given by the Scout Association of Malta.


- 1957 Nearing 50 years of scouting in Malta, the Rabat Group participated in the 9th World Scout Jamboree, also known as the Jubilee Jamboree, held at Birmingham, England.
- 1963 The Group participated in the 11th World Scout Jamboree in Marathon, Greece.
- 1968 On the 55th Anniversary of the registration of the Group Mr. Frank Vassallo was appointed Scoutmaster.
- 1971 Dr. Joseph Cacciottolo appointed Group Scout Leader.
- 1977 Mr Martin Scicluna took charge of the Group.
- 1982 The Group sets up headquarters in a hired house in Lion's Well Alley. This was subsequent to moving out of Depiro Youth Centre which was followed by utilising a large room at the Rabat Civic Centre as temporary headquarters.
- 1983 Rabat Group was amongst the Groups that participated in the 75th

anniversary of the Scout Association of Malta.

- 1988 The 1st Rabat Scout Group celebrates its 75th. Anniversary and participates in an exchange visit with Isle of Wight.
- 1990 Marica Cascun (later Chappell) invested as the first female member of the Group.
- 1998 Two members of the Group attend the 19th World Scout Jamboree in Picarquin, Chile.
- 1999 The annual Summer Camp is held in Marineo Scout Centre in Sicily. The lease on premises being used as Headquarters in Lion's Well Alley expires and the Group finds itself without a Headquarters. The Rabat Local Council offers as temporary headquarters the use of three rooms within the Local Council Offices. Efforts towards a permanent solution for the Group's headquarters intensify.
- 2000 Mr. Joseph Borg, who had been taking care of all the day to day running of the



Group for the previous years, was appointed as Group Scout Leader. The Group adopts the co-education system by investing its first girl Cubs. Girls were introduced incrementally with the full adoption being finalised in 2006. Millennium celebrations were held together with the 7th Rabat Girl Guides.



• 2002 Parliament passes a resolution whereby the 1st Rabat Scout Group is granted the use of land in Rudolph Saliba Street to be developed into Headquarters.





- 2007 On the centenary of World Scouting, the Group participated in the 21st World Scout Jamboree in Hylands Park at Chelmsford, Essex, U.K.
- Mr Jason Deguara is appointed as Group Scout Leader. This followed the appointment the previous Group Scout Leader Joseph Borg as Acting Assistant Chief Commissioner.
- **2010** The new Headquarters in Rudolph Saliba Street is officially inaugurated on Sunday 21st. November
- 2011 The Group attended the 22nd World Scout Jamboree in Rinkaby, Sweden.






