THE WORK OF THE SAVE THE CHILDREN FUND IN MALTA

Very few people realize what close ties are being forged between Maltese children and the Commonwealth through the Save the Children Fund by means of the Sponsorship Fund. This Fund is only part of the work done by our Malta Branch. Children are chosen by sponsors from all over the Commonwealth through the London Office and money and clothes are sent to Malta for these children's needs. By means of letters, firm friendships are formed, some of which help the children when perhaps they emigrate.

Our Family Assistance Scheme is an experimental nucleus for "family allowance". We give milk and meat to selected families on Social Service Relief to help widowed mothers feed their families.

Apart from all this the Malta Save the Children Fund Branch, is always ready to consider cases of hardship among children in Malta and to help where and how it can. 

CLASSICAL BALLET

Classical Ballet, like other Arts which made history, has always been seeking beauty and perfection. In this kind of dancing, which stands in a category of its own, the expression flows out of harmonious movements in which the feeling and moods are to be presented within a poetical frame of action.

It is known that Dancing in it's entity has always been used to enact a part without words, a thought or even a religious sense in gone-by long days. In the case of "Ballet Classique" it is mostly exteriorising music into action with a faint story in the background. Set rules govern the school of ballet movements, but a personal touch brings charm to the work through the individual approach of each performer.

Classical Ballet was born in a century of cultural developement, when graciousness and aesthetics commanded the artistic inclinations; for that reason ballet is dignified and graceful in its conception. Nevertheless, on the basis of its technique, various styles in character performances can be achieved. Brilliance and control of it's system offer ample possibilities in reaching "finesse" of performance in various styles.

In opposition to modern ballets, the "roundness" and grace in arm movements is an essential rule. Classical Ballet also prefers to present the Art in an atmosphere of magic and fairyland.

The Art is not an easy one and requires dedication if a high standard of efficiency is to be achieved.
