

DAVID PARKHOUSE AND EILEEN CROXFORD

David Parkhouse won a Major Scholarship to the Royal School of Music when he was fourteen. Three years later he won the highest prize for piano playing, the Chapell Gold Medal, and in 1953 won the Boise Foundation Award, followed by the Queen's Prize a year after.

His studies were interrupted by National Service, when he joined the R.A.F. During these two years he was stationed abroad and was able to give many recitals in N. Germany, often broadcasting from Hamburg.

On returning to England he had the honour of playing before Her Majesty the Queen (then H.R.H. Princess Elizabeth) when he performed Cesar Franck's Symphonic Variations with orchestra. David Parkhouse broadcasts frequently on the air and television, in concertos, solo recitals and chamber music.

Eileen Croxford commenced her musical studies at the age of five with her parents and at twelve won a scholarship for lessons with Miss Effie Richardson. Later she studied with Ivor James at the Royal College of Music, and afterwards in Prades with the well known 'cellist Paul Casals. On her return she gave her first London recital at the Wigmore Hall.

In 1948 she was awarded the Queen's Prize and as a result played before the Queen. Two years later she was the winner of the Boise Foundation Award, which enabled her to continue her studies with Casals.

She made her London debut in 1945 as soloist, with Marie Wilson, in a broadcast performance of the Brahms Double Concerto in a Promenade concert at the Royal Albert Hall with the B.B.C. Symphony Orchestra conducted by Sir Adrian Boult. She has since had great success in concertos with the Halle Orchestra under Sir John Barbirolli, the Bournemouth Orchestra and the B.B.C. Northern, Scottish and Welsh Orchestras.

She has formed a 'cello and piano ensemble with her husband David Parkhouse, with whom, in addition to concertos and lecture recitals throughout the British Isles, she has toured extensively in France, Germany, Switzerland, Holland, Denmark and North Africa.
