





Brian Hubbard was born in Norfolk, and took an interest in the theatre at a very early age. After studying music for two years, in Kings Lynn, he joined the R.A.F., in 1945, and brought with him his considerable talents. He has been associated with Drama Clubs in Germany, Aden and Marham, and while in Marham he produced "The Amorous Prawn" which came 2nd in the Bomber Command Drama Competition of 1967.

From Marham he came to Malta and his first production was the highly successful pantomime, "Aladdin". Not only did Brian produced this pantomime, he also wrote it in collaboration with John Cockle.

Brian's second production for the Ariel Players was "Reluctant Heroes", which gained second place in the Cyprus Drama Festival, only one point behind the winner.

Brian has not only done a considerable amount for the club production wise, but has also made use of his considerable acting talents. He played the part of Theseus in "Rape of the Belt". Joe in "Alfie", and more recently Herr Schneider in "As Long as They're Happy".

"Cinderella" will be Brian's last production in Malta, as he and his wife Phyl, also a hardworking club member, are leaving in February, much to the regret of all their fellow club members

Besides amateur dramatics, Brian's interests are comedy writing, gardening and collecting old wood-carvings.

Our pantomime has been written by three of our members with the expressed intention of entertaining young and old alike. Colourful costumes, dancing, slap-stick comedy and a liberal spicing of local, inoffensive "rib tickling".

"CINDERELLA" is played by our golden voiced Angela Overall and, in keeping with traditional pantomine Prince Charming is played by a girl, on this occasion the very attractive and long legged Penny Tatton, and the "Ugly Sisters" by our not so attractive comedy duo John Baker and John Walker.

Daphne Lungaro and her pupils add colour and grace to the Pantomine with some very spectacular dance arrangements.


