








The Corradino Correctional Facility is situated at Valletta Road Paola and houses the only civil prisons in Malta. The Motto "Suavis Aspero" means "Firm but Gentle".

Apart from the main prisons at Paola there are other locations that are considered by law as places of custody, these are as follows:

- Substance Abuse Therapeutic Unit (SATU) at Mtahleb
- Valletta Lock-Up (beneath the Malta Law Courts)
- Forensic Unit (Mount Carmel Hospital) at Attard


Design




Age cohorts - 1990s












School Type: Migrants 1990s - percentages




Migrants – Higher educational level Naturalised - mainly technical or trade


