

No other praise fits him better as a climax to his career than the public declaration by Bliss, when the latter extolled the fine playing of the Orchestra, being conducted by him, as rehearsed by Maestro Sammut.

Although Miss Bain has resided in Malta for some years, this is the first time she has undertaken any theatrical work on the Island. This she has done only at the invitation of her friend and colleague Diana Vernon for whom she produced "Hansel and Gretel" in Hove some years ago.

A working life of over thirty years in the theatre cannot be described here, sufficient to say that it included numerous provincial tours, some west-end shows, and endless Rep. and involved playing every type of part in a wide variety of plays both classical and commercial. In more recent years Miss Bain has concentrated almost entirely on production, eventually running her own company. This company known as The Kings Players visited schools or performed to audiences of school children in theatres. These performances were accompanied by lectures on Shakespeare and the history of Drama which Miss Bain gave all over the British Isles and on the continent.


It is a lifelong love of opera and music that finally wakened a desire in Miss Bain to work with an operatic coach and to give young singers some very necessary training in acting


Celia has had many successes in Music Festivals throughout the South of England, and is studying full-time towards a career in opera.

DIANA VERNON
The Witch

Diana Vernon trained at the Royal Academy of Music, where she won the Gold Medal for Operatic Singing. She also took extensive training under the famous teacher Berta Nicklaus-Kempner for operatic work.

Seven years ago, she started the Hove Academy of Music for the special training of young people towards professional careers in singing.

The Hove Academy of Music, which provides a complete musical education, drama and languages, has proved very successful. All the Vocal Technique is taught by Diana Vernon, and the young cast appearing in this production have been trained by her.

THE STORY

Act I: THE COTTAGE

The poor broom-maker and his wife, with their two children, Hansel and Gretel, live in a small cottage near to the forest. Hansel makes brooms for his father to sell, and Gretel knits to help her mother. While their mother is out, the hungry children get tired of working, and start to dance. Their mother comes home exhausted and worried because they have nothing to eat and, finding the children playing, she gets angry and orders them to go into the forest to pick wild strawberries for supper. Her husband returns from the town having had a good day, but is horrified to hear that the children have been sent to the haunted wood.

Act II: THE FOREST

Hansel and Gretel are enjoying themselves in the forest when all at once they realise that the sun has set and they are lost. They are terrified, and imagine that they see and hear frightening shapes and sounds all around them; but the Sandman appears and lulls them to sleep. During the night they dream that Angels from Heaven come to watch over them.

Act III: THE GINGERBREAD HOUSE

The Dew Fairy wakes Hansel and Gretel in the morning and suddenly they see a beautiful little house made of sweets and cakes. They start to eat, and get caught by the Witch, who turns children into gingerbread. But Hansel and Gretel outwit the horrible witch and instead turn her into gingerbread. They have just released all the other children whom the Witch has ensnared, when their parents arrive to take them safely home again.




JILL MORFORD Mother

This is her first solo role in opera. She appeared in "Julius Caesar Jones" as leader of the chorus, and understudy to "Nora".


Now studying for Final Diploma in Singing (L.R.A.M.) which she will take in April.

Janet joined the Hove Academy in 1967, and was awarded the Diana Vernon Scholarship to study singing.



ENGELBERT HUMPERDINCK

Engelbert Humperdinck was born in Siegburg on the Rhine in 1854. He attended the local grammar school and soon showed his musical abilities. He won a 'Mozart Scholarship' and a 'Mendelssohn Foundation Prize', thereby studying in Italy. He met Wagner in Naples, and at his invitation assisted him at Bayreuth in the production of "Parsifal". Humperdinck actually wrote a little of the music, in a transition scene, where Wagner's music was found to be too short to fill the required time. Humperdinck then won another Prize — the 'Meyerbeer Prize' of Berlin, and from 1881 to 1887 he travelled and taught in Italy, France and Spain.

His works include "Humoreske" for Orchestra, "Hansel and Gretel", "Dornröschen" "Konigskinder" and "Gaudeamus" (all Operas) and much incidental music to Shakespeare's plays. The Libretto for "Hansel and Gretel" was written by Humperdinck's sister Adelheid Wette, and was based on the well-known Grimm's Fairytale. Humperdinck finally settled in Boppard on the Rhine, spending his last few years teaching and in retirement. He produced no musical works during the ten years before his death in Neustrelitz in 1921.




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
