

Wilma Vernocchi, born in Forli, is undoubtedly one of the greatest sopranos of the present generation. She is a really polished singer, thanks to the sense of balance and good taste that characterize her and win admiration. In 1970 she was the winner of the International Competition for the best "Cio-Cio-San" in Puccini's "Madame Butterfly", held at Osaka (Japan) in memory of the famous Japanese interpreter of Puccini's opera Tamaki Miura. During the Opera Season 1970/71, Wilma Vernocchi will interpret "Adina" in Donizetti's "Elisir d'Amore" at the "Teatro alla Scala" and "Madame Butterfly" at the Metropolitan of New York. Having won several prizes, she has already sung, though still very young, in other theatres the world over and her repertoire consists of twenty-two operas.



Renzo Casellato studied singing at the "Conservatorio Benedetto Marcello" of Venice and at the Training School of "La Fenice" Venice. Having come to the limelight in 1963. he has already sung at the "Scala" of Milan, the "Reggio" of Genoa the "Comunale" of Bologna, the "San Carlo" of Naples the "Teatro dell'Opera of Rome, the "Massimo" of Palermo, the "Bellini" of Catania, etc. He has also appeared with success in the theatres of Chicago, Buenos Aires, Moscow, Montecarlo, Nice, Belgrade, London, Copenhagen, Marseille, Vienna etc.

At the "Scala" he has sung in Falstaff, Cenerentola, Don Pasquale, Barbiere di Siviglia, Clemenza di Tito, Elisir d'Amore and in various Concerts.

Anna Luci Sanvitale after having obtained her Diploma in piano, has dedicated herself to teaching and to giving concerts. Her playing is endowed with an exquisite delicacy and an exceptional artistic feeling, and she is considered as one of the best accompanists. She still teaches scores of old and modern composers to many singers, amongst whom figure the Baritone Claudio Ciombi and the Tenor Ermanno Lorenzi, both from Trieste, who sing in the most renowned theatres of the world.
