THE LEGEND

Orpheus, the son of a Thracian king and Calliope, was the greatest of poets and musicians; the Muses had taught him to play the lyre given to him by Apollo, and his music was reputed to tame even wild beasts.

He had a very beautiful wife, Eurydice, who was being passionately pursued by the rural deity Aristaeus, the god of olive-groves and of honey; while fleeing from him one day, she was bitten by a serpent and died.

Orpheus was broken-hearted and descended into Hades to beg the Gods of the Underworld to restore his wife to him. The Gods were so enchanted by his music that they agreed to return his wife, but on one condition — he was to walk in front of her and not look behind him till they were both safely back on earth. Unfortunately, Orpheus turned to see if Eurydice was following, whereupon she was condemned to stay forever in the Underworld.

THE OPERETTA

For this operetta, Offenbach made his own light-hearted changes in the story. Eurydice is pursued, not by Aristaeus, but by Pluto himself, disguised as Aristaeus; and Pluto arranges for her to be bitten and to die, and then carries her off to Hades

Orpheus, apparently is delighted to have lost Eurydice, but he is forced by his mother, Calliope, to ask the Gods on Mt. Olympus to help get her back. They fly there by balloon and approach Jupiter. Jupiter, who is quite a playboy, is anxious to meet Eurydice because he has heard so much about her beauty; so he takes all his followers to Hades where he contends with Pluto for her attentions.

Jupiter decides that Eurvdice may return to earth with Orpheus provided he does not look behind him on the way. But he does look back when Jupiter craftily struck him to make him turn; this is accepted as breaking the agreement, so Eurvdice is condemned to stay. But Jupiter and Pluto disagree as to which of them she will belong to. She is left free to choose; and she chooses?
