Antonio Manoel De Vilhena

Grand Master Antonio Manoel de Vilhena, a Portuguese, was elected Grand Master in 1722. A man of great intellectual qualities, he was popular with all, and his "savoire faire" earned him everyone's love.

At the beginning of his reign, fearing a second Turkish invasion of Malta, he promptly took steps for such an eventuality, and the enemy, seeing his preparedness, sailed away without even attempting a landing.

Having fortified the Island, he began to find ways and means to encourage civil enterprise, and in the political field he managed to negotiate a treaty of peace with the Sultan of Constantinople.

As a befitting gesture towards the People of Malta, he built in 1732 the Manoel Theatre, a living monument to his achievements, which keeps his memory fresh and glorious in all those that cultivate the Arts and all those who seek an honest recreation, as the Theatre's motto implies: "Ad honestatem populi oblectationem."

SYMPHONY No. 6 IN B MINOR

"PATHETIQUE"

TSCHAIKOWSKY

Adagio — Allegro non troppo — Allegro con grazia —

Allegro molto vivace — Adagio — Andante.

In no other work did Tschaikowsky express the suffering and mental pain of his life more poignantly than in the first and fourth movement of this symphony. It is almost as if, in the closing months of his life, he reviewed his lifelong sufferings, and, as if, in writing into the last movement as heart-rending an expression of grief as is to be found anywhere in his music, he wrote his own threnody.

Tschaikowsky himself conducted the premiere of the Symphony on October 28, 1893, to a rather apathetic audience although his faith in the work remained unshaken by this cool reception. Nine days later he died of cholera.

There are many unusual features in this symphony. There is the strange tonality of the opening: not in the Key of B minor but in the subdominant. There is, furthermore, the placement of the slow movement at the end of the work. Finally, there is the unusual juxtaposition of a light and graceful movement.

The fourth symphony excels in sheer picturesqueness, the fifth symphony in poetic feeling, but in the sixth we feel that strongly personal note which rarely fails to appeal to sympathetic souls. Tschaikowsky affixed no programme to it, but the story of a tortured soul, seeking an anodyne for its misery in the rapture of pleasure and in the ecstasy of battle, and finally sinking to hopeless pessimism and suicide.

When Tschaikowsky wrote the symphony pathetique he had attained such mastery of his material as gives him right to rank among great musicians. Whatever he chose to say he could express with absolute certainty of touch. In the Symphonic pathetic there are no effects that misfire, no details that do not "come off" . . . It must stand as a very interesting and complete picture of a certain frame of mind, probably the completest expression of the "fin de siecle" that has ever been written.


