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GEORGE ROSSITER

George Rossiter was educated at the University College College School, London, and at Clifton College. He then studied to become a Chartered Accountant prior to going into Commerce. He joined the Territorial Army before the outbreak of war in 1939, and served until 1967 when he retired and came out to Malta to live.

From 1947 until 1967 he was able to go into the Theatre world and quickly started his own Company, The Manchester Intimate Theatre. From this he became Principal of the Webber-Douglas School of Dramatic Art, later to become the Webber-Douglas Academy, which he ran for 10 years. In 1961 he also joined the Barry O'Brien Organisation as a Director and thus became responsible for putting on many plays in London and the Provinces. He retired in 1967 and came out to Malta to live and has regularly been involved in the amateur Theatre here since then.

This light Comedy, by Alan Ayckbourn, was presented by Peter Bridge at the Duke of York Theatre, London, on 29th March 1967. Mr. Ayckbourn is very well known for the delightful comedies he has written in the past seven years. He displays a keen sense of comedy timing which makes his plays very tricky to direct and also difficult in which to act. He also has the ability of being able to write what can be called "a well-constructed play" and this is very obvious when one has seen this particular one. Many people may say that the play is somewhat old-fashioned but whether this is so or not, the fact remains that it is an excellent comedy and one which I am sure everyone will enjoy. I am also sure that a most amusing and entertaining evening will be enjoyed by all.

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
