DVORAK'S STABAT MATER

Dvorak had only reached the end of the final act of his unsuccessful opera "Wanda" when his eldest daughter died, after a brief illness. Naturally this tragic event cast a shadow over the first compositions of the following year, 1876. These were the pianoforte Trio in G minor, the string Quartet in E minor and his setting of STABAT MATER. This fine work, dedicated to the Union of Musical Artists, his real memorial to his daughter, was sketched out between 19th February and 7th May 1876 and not finally completed until 13th November 1877.

Stabat Mater is the first oratorio of modern Czech music. It was destined to bring Dvorak world-wide fame especially in England. The first performance at Prague was delayed until 23rd December 1880.

This first Czech oratorio opens with a poetical prelude, pictorial in its widely spaced unisons in the first bars, which suggest the Mother gazing up at the Cross. It is emotional in its chromatic theme and rising tide of feeling. The melodic appeal is perfectly frank, sincere as well as fresh.

The opening chorus, twenty-five slowly moving pages of vocal score with its chromatic theme and verbal repetitions is an expression of grief. In the succeeding chain of solos, concerted pieces and choruses one is alternately enchanted by the sheer melodic beauty of the music and by Dvorak's feeling for the voice, for which he always writes beautifully and effectively.

The final movement 'Quando Corpus Morietur' is closely related thematically to the opening chorus. Dvorak chooses to end quietly and beautifully.




