

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
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CANTORION ARDWYN

Formed in 1964, the Choir has developed into one of the finest mixed choirs in Wales. Led by Helena Braithwaite they have travelled widely in the U.S.A., Canada and Europe. They have sung at such venues as the Royal Albert Hall, Westminster Abbey, Washington Cathedral and the Stuttgart Liederhalle and are in constant demand to sing on Television and Radio.

In 1977 the choir achieved international renown Llangollen international Eisteddfod; a double Premier Choral Award at the Cork international by becoming the first Welsh Choir to win the on to claim the Chief Choral Competition at the Choral and Folk Dance Festival, before going success that would be difficult to equal anywhere in the world.

A further honour was bestowed open the Choir in 1978 when they were invited to represent Wales at Festival '78 the first 'Commonwealth Cultural Fest'val' presented in association with the XIth Commonwealth Games in Edmonton, Canada.

Following the success they achieved in Edmonton the Ardwyn Singers visited Malta in 1979.

In 1980 the choir were invited to the U.S.A. for the fourth time and sang in Vancouver, Seattle, Santa Rosa and San Francisco. A year lattr they represented Wales in the Stuttgart Choral Festival, together with choirs from all over the world, including India, U.S.A., and other European countries. During this Festival the choir gave a world premier of a specially commissioned work by Prof. William Mathias, the composer of the Anthem for the Royal Wedding Ceremony in 1981. Since then the choir has moved in a new direction, performing for television the 'Elijah' by Medlessohn and Verdi's 'Requiem' with some of the finest soloists and orchestras in Britain. Recently they have accepted a three year contract with the BBC to perform three major works each year with the BBC Welsh Orchestra in Wales and other venues throughout the world.




De Vilhena

Grand Master Antonio Manoel de Vilhena, a Portuguese, was elected Grand Master in 1722. A man of great intellectual qualities he was popular with all, and his "savoir faire" earned him everyone's love.

At the beginning of his reign, fearing a second Turkish invasion of Malta, he promptly took steps against such an eventuality, and the enemy, seeing his preparedness, sailed away without even attempting a landing.

Having fortified the Island, he began to find ways and means of encouraging civil enterprise, and in the political field he managed to negotiate a treaty of peace with the Sultan of Constantinople.

As a befitting gesture towards the People of Malta, he built in 1732 the Manoel Theatre which is a living monument to his achievements. It keeps his memory fresh and glorious in all those who cultivate the Arts and all those who seek an honest recreation, as is implied by the Theatre's motto: "Ad honestatem populi oblectationem."



MANOEL THEATRE BOOKING PLAN


Late comers will not be admitted to the Auditorium.
