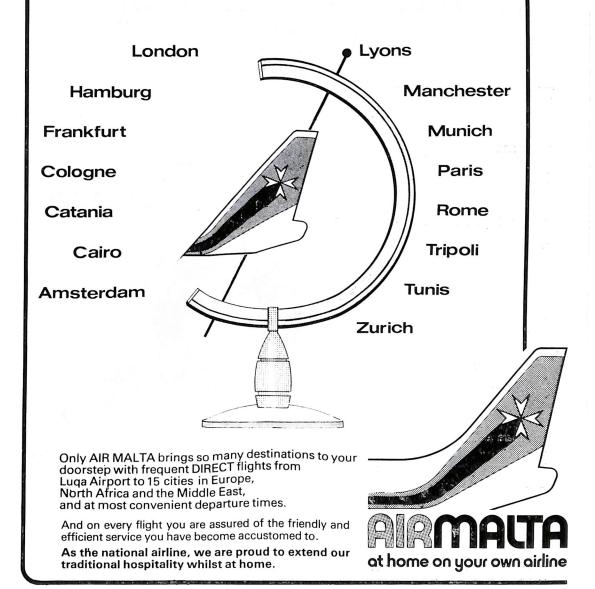

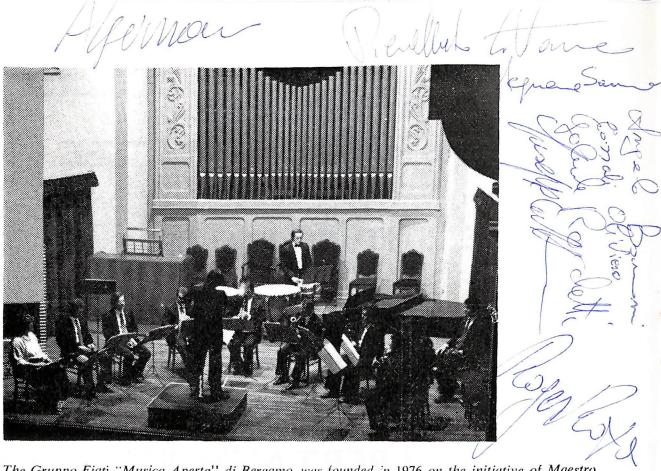

AT THE MANOEL THEATRE



The Gruppo Fiati "Musica Aperta" di Bergamo was founded in 1976 on the initiative of Maestro Pieralberto Cattaneo and other players of the Ist tuto Musicale "G. Donizetti". They intended to evaluate the experience of group playing, to present music, which, owing to the rare formation of such groups, are hardly ever heard and to interpret works of Baroque composers (Bach and Vivaldi) Classical composers (Haydn, Mozart, Beethoven, Rosett) Romantics (Schubert, Gounod and some unedited works by Donizetti and Mayr) as well as modern and contemporary ones (Debussy, Bartok, Hindemith, Villa Lobos, Jelinek, Maderna, Kotonski, Pousseur, Cattaneo). Individually, the players have collaborated with the orchestras of various theatres — the La Scala, the Donizetti of Bergamo, the Comunale of Treviso — and the RAI of M'lan. But as a group, they already have to their credit an intense musical activity which has immediately distinguished them for the high artistic quality of their interpretation. The Gruppo Fiati won First Prize in the category "Groups" at the Stresa International Contest.

The "Gruppo" has also been the guest of important Italian Concert Associations such as the "Accademia Filarmonica di Bologna", "Accademia Tadini di Lovere", "Estate Musicale Frentana", "Giovani Interpreti Associati di Brescia" and the "Festival Donizettiano di Bergamo". The Bergamo born director of the *Gruppo Fiati*, composer Pieralberto Cattaneo, obtained his degree with honours in the Arts, Music and Performance at the University of Bologna with a thesis on the Sacred music of Donizetti. He studied composition with Maestro Vittorio Fellegara and Maestro Bruno Martinotti. He followed courses in score reading at the *Conservatorio* Giuseppe Verdi of Milan and has supervised the revision of unpublished works. He has done his post-diploma studies at the *Accademia Chigiana* with Franco Donatoni and at Groznjan in Jugoslavia with Witold Lutoslawski. He participated in concerts (The Castello di Belveglio, the Cassadò, the Malipiero and the Chamber Music Contest of Portofino) where he succeeded in obtaining various prizes and "honourable mentions". The *Terzo Programma radiofonico has* entruted him with the composition of a piece of music which has already been performed at Modena, Ferrara and Piacenza in the programme *Vie della Nuova Musica*.

Antonio Manoel De Vilhena

Grand Master Antonio Manoel de Vilhena, a Portuguese, was elected Grand Master in 1722. A man of great intellectual qualities, he was popular with all, and his "savoir faire" earned him everyone's love.

At the beginning of his reign, fearing a second Turkish invasion of Malta, he promptly took steps against such an eventuality, and the enemy, seeing his preparedness, sailed away without even attempting a landing.

Having fortified the Island, he began to find ways and means of encouraging civil enterprise, and in the political field he managed to negotiate a treaty of peace with the Sultan of Constantinople.

As a befitting gesture towards the People of Malta, he built in 1732 the Manoel Theatre which is a living monument to his achievements. It keeps his memory fresh and glorious in all those who cultivate the Arts and all those who seek an honest recreation, as is implied by the Theatre's motto: "Ad honestatem populi oblectationem."

Octet in B flat

MYSLIVECEK

- Allegro — Larghetto con un poco di moto — Presto

Josef Myslivecek was born near Prague in 1737 and died in poverty in Rome in 1781. He composed over thirty Italian operas and many instrumental works, and was much admired by Mozart who performed his sonatas in Munich and wrote advising his sister "to play them with plenty of expression, taste and fire, and to learn them by heart."

The influence of Czech folk music is heard in his chamber works, especially in the variable forms of his melodies. In the preface to his edition of Myslivecek's three octets for wind instruments Schoenbaum wrote "In Myslivecek's compositional art, Czech musicality merges with Italian influences to form an individual style, whose formal balance and harmonic variety paved the way for the Viennese Classical masters".

It is therefore fitting that this evening the Gruppo Fiati not only introduce many of us to the msuic of Myslivecek, but follow him with his admirer Mozart.

Serenade in E flat K. 375

MOZART

Allegro maestoso — Menuetto I — Adagio — Menuetto II — Allegro

It is perhaps significant that this work was composed in Vienna in 1781, the year of Myslivecek's death. It was written for two clarinets, two horns, and two bassoons, the two oboes being added in the revised version of July 1782. This is the first of Mozart's substantial wind serenades.

It opens with the martial rhythm Mozart often uses in works in E flat, and is in the expansive, leisurely manner suited to serenade music.

INTERVAL

Octet in E flat Op. 103

BEETHOVEN

Allegro — Andante — Menuetto Allegro — Finale Presto

This work was probably written in Bonn in Beethoven's early years before 1793, and then revised in Vienna in 1793. Chronologically it might have been influenced by Myslivecek and Mozart's works for wind instruments.

This is one of the more sophisticated of Beethoven's earlier works. He made a version of it for string quintet which he published in 1797 as op. 4, and another arrangement for piano trio op. 63.

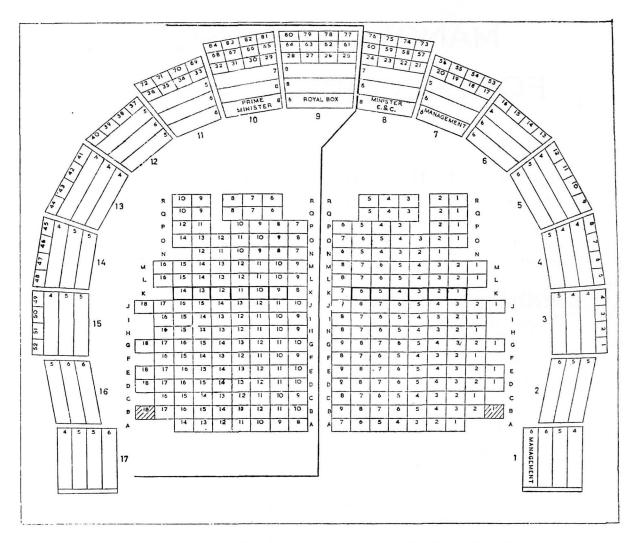
