Michael Sellers is a seasoned artist known for a strong and commanding presence, a big temperament, an exceptional virtuoso equipment, and a warmly, personal, spacious, and poetic style of performance. He has recorded three albums for Orion Records under the sponsorship of the Yehudi Menuhin Foundation. He has the support and interest of such leading musicians as Leonard Bernstein (whose Touches was premiered by Sellers in 1982,

in Rome) Lukas Foss, Andre Previn and Gerhard Samuel. He thinks of the piano as a vital medium for living composers to link the past with the future and has worked with a number of composers in preparing works for first performances. He will be giving Leo Ornstein's *Three Moods* its Maltese premiere. Subtitled *Anger, Grief* and *Jor* this exciting piece explains why Ornstein is considered "one of the major figures representing all that is new in music".
