## Of skies and seas

HF common thread in Alexia Coppini's paintings is the representation of big skies and vast seas. Nothing intellectual or conceptual, just the representation of the natural environment in the most tranquil

Bach painting speaks for itself. Ms Coppini lives by the sea, in fact her studio is on the Sliema promenade and therefore she is gasily absorbed by the beauty of the The and the natural environment. Ms Coppini's paintings evoke a sense of the spiritual as well as the fluid nature of the sea, and the light in the air gives a sense of tilinclessness.

Ms Coppini is versatile in various subjects, including portraits, still life and animals. She also has a great passion to draw and paint images from marine and landscape. The natural environment is a great source of inspiration.

In her latest solo exhibition, titled Happy Birthday, Ms Coppini is showing the public a series of seascapes, skies and fascinating images of bulls and

dragonflies. I believe that her work creates the effect of a "cinemascope" of nature in which abstraction occurs naturally. The artist attempts to convey the overall atmosphere of an area Her paintings are vistas or windows to the outside world. This is the projection of the "self" through vivid depictions of vast seas, some of them calm and others with surfing tides expressing turbulence. We know that in various cultural traditions the sea is considered the source of life. It stimulates imagination and enhances imaginative expression in art, poetry and mythology. Stormy seas represent emotional upheavals. whereas calm seas evoke a sense of peace of mind. It is also stated that to return to the sea means to return to the mother's womb. which is also an encounter between life and death.

In one ofher paintings called Heaven we see a circular composition of clouds in the form of a mandala (Indian Sanskrit for a circular, often spiraling pattern). This is not the first time that Ms. Coppini created a composition consisting of a formation of clouds in the sky in circular form. In psychological terms it represents the symbolical aspect of wholeness

or self-representation of the process called individuation becoming a single, homogenous being, self-realisation. In other words it is this individuation which consists of the bringing together of the conscious and the unconscious.

The light in some of her sky paintings is bright and pure and the scene almost seems to vibrate. Sometimes there is no horizon in others when she captures the line which separates the sea and the sky, a sense of drama is felt. Ms Coppini's panoramic canvases of the sea are set either early in the morning or sometimes late in the evening especially during that magical time of the day when the colours are dynamic and range between the darkest darks and the lightest lights.

Her attitude to art and to creativity is twofold; she has an intimate eye for what is beautiful and appealing in nature and an emotional connection with the world. In this exhibition we find the images of a bull which is a symbol of power and energy: it is a symbol found in many epochs and mythological cycles. It is an archetypal image that reached heights of importance and dominated the iconography of various cultures signifying

bestiality. As previously stated, other symbolic images in this art show include the dragonfly which is also a reference to the symbol of transformation and life's everconstant process of change. Precisely, the artist is in constant

sexuality and regeneration as well

as man's spiritual nature over his

change and the dragonfly sparks the creative power of her imagination. The artist is in fact living in an aura of great fantasy.

Happy Birthday embodies an important phase in the artist's life. Through her art Ms Coppini lives in times of joy and serenity. It is another artistic statement in her continuous exploration of nature.
