


COMINO TOWER


One of the main things that preoccupied the Order of St John when it took over the Maltese Islands was that these islands had no adequate defence system. In order to fortify the islands against corsair raids and invasions, watch towers and fortresses were built along the coastline.

On September 29, 2006 Maltapost issued a set of five stamps depicting castles and towers around the Maltese islands. The 37c value represents the tower situated on the island of Comino.



The tower is forty feet high. Its walls are five metres thick and rises 230 feet above sea level. It dominates the channel crossing between Malta and Gozo.

Two hundred men were detailed in this tower to stop enemy



attempts to land on these islands and to report any enemy movements. The Maltese resistance movement used this tower following the French invasion in 1798. Later the tower was used by the British and subsequently by the Armed Forces of Malta. Todav the tower restored to its original state thanks to "Din l-Art Helwa" and is open for visits by appointment.

Malta Christmas Stamps 2010

On November 9 Maltapost p.l.c. issued a set of three Christmas stamps. This is the 47th consecutive set of Christmas stamps issued in Malta since 1964. Two of these stamps depict old paintings to be found in Gozo.

The €0.19 stamp depicts 'The Adoration Of The Magi', which is to be found at the Lombard Bank, Malta. This painting is by Valerio Castello, 1624-1659. This Italian artist was very active in Genoa during his short life. His works are regarded as combining the style of Veronese with the fire of Tintoretto.

The €0.37 stamp depicts 'The Flight into Egypt', which is to be found at St. Mary's Cathedral Museum at the Cittadella, Victoria, Gozo. Formerly it used to be the titular painting at the old St. Joseph chapel at the Cittadella.



This painting was attributed to Filippo Paladini, 1544-1614, who was a painter originally from Tuscany. Like Caravaggio he took refuge in Malta between 1590 and 1595 during the Grand Mastership of Verdala, and later in Sicily, for problems with justice. His works are to be found in churches in many cities in Sicily: Palermo, Modica, Caltanissetta, Catania, Licata, Acireale, Vizzini, Mineo, Caltagirone and Mazzarino and of

course also in Malta. Yet now this painting is attributed to an unknown Northern European artist.

The €0.63 stamp depicts the 'Madonna Di Maggio', which is to be found at St. George's Basilica, Victoria, Gozo. This painting hangs under the titular painting of St. George and the Dragon by Mattia Preti. This painting is attributed to a not so well known artist Pierre Guillemin and painted in 1732.


Various Gozo Philatelic Society members participated in a public lecture about Christmas in Philately and particularly Malta's stamps (delivered by founder-member George Vella) at the main Lending Library on the occasion of the 25th



anniversary of the *Għaqda Ħbieb tal-Presepju* ("Friends of the Crib"). Mr Vella had designed a handstamp for the auspicious day and we obviously produced a Cover! (below)

Spiritual Director Canon Michael Borg encouraged families to instil this interest in their children and PRO Chev Joe M Attard issued a commemoratory poem. The foundation took place in the village of San Lawrenz in 1985 and efforts were begun immediately to acquire membership in the *Universalis Foederatio Praesepistica* (the international federation of such organizations). Thus this Gozitan NGO represents the whole of Malta!

The Committee participates regularly in overseas events and organizes activities locally to encourage interest and support the crafts necessary for crib-building. It distributes an illustrated periodical and has published a multi-lingual "Story of Cribs and Pasturi in the Maltese Islands". A permanent exhibition can be visited at the premises under the Bishop's Curia (in Victoria's Republic Street)

Stamp Issuers Past and Present

- **LATVIA** (*Latvija*): Nordic state with stamps 1918-40 (when became part of USSR) and again from 1991; Russian occupation, German occupation (*Ostland*).
- **League of Nations:** Swiss stamps (*Societe des Nations* or *SdN*) for the Geneva offices 1922-46.
- **LEBANON** (*Liban*): Formerly part of the Turkish Empire, French Mandate stamps were issued from 1924 and independence proclaimed in 1941; British, French and German PO.
- **Leeward Islands:** General issues for the West Indian islands of Antigua, Dominica, Montserrat, Nevis, St Christopher and Virgin Islands were issued from 1890 to 1956.
- **Lemnos:** Overprinted stamps for Aegean island occupied by Greece in 1912 and united in 1913.
- **Leon:** overprinted stamps were issued here in 1914 during the Mexican Civil War.
- **Leros:** Italian occupation overprinted stamps for this Aegean island were issued from 1912.
- **Lesbos:** Overprinted stamps for Aegean island occupied by Greece in 1912 and united in 1913.
- **LESOTHO:** Southern Africa state became independent in 1966 formerly Basutoland.
- **Levant:** various foreign POs (from 1885) in Turkish Eastern Mediterranean, including British. French and Italian.

LIBERIA: West African state with stamps from 1860.

Libia = Libya.

LIBYA: North African country which became independent (amalgamating Cyrenaica, Fezzan, Ghadames and Tripolitania) in 1951; Italian colonial issues from 1912.

LIECHTENSTEIN: Principality near Switzerland with own stamps from 1912.

Lietuva = Lithuania.

Lima: Peru local issues 1871-3.

Limnos: see Lemnos.

Lipsos: Italian occupation overprinted stamps for this Aegean island were issued from 1912.

LITHUANIA: (*Lietuva*) Baltic state with stamps from 1918 to 1940 (when incorporated in USSR); independent again from 1990; stamps were issued in 1919 during Russian occupation; Poland issued stamps 1920-2 during occupation of Central Lithuania; German occupation stamps were issued in 1941.

Litwa = Lithuania.

Litzmannstadt: stamp issued in Lodz (Poland) in 1944.

Bold italic = Inscriptions;

BOLD CAPITALS = Current Issuers;

Bold = Former Issuers.

PROMOTING GOZO THROUGH PHILATELY THE GOZO BANCA GIURATALE

The Gozo Banca Giuratale knows its origins to the establishment of the Gozo Commune or Universitas Gaudisii around the year 1350 when Malta and Gozo were under the domination of the Aragonese rulers. On October 7 of that year our islands were returned to the royal demanium at the request of the inhabitants themselves and most probably it was also in that year that the Gozitan Local Government was set up; so much so that the Gozo Commune is first referred to in a document of 1373 with regard to the approval of Petrus de Trapano as Notary Public for Gozo.

The Universitas was headed by a captain, officially known as Captain of the Rod (Capitano della Verga), since he carried a rod as a symbol of his authority, who was appointed annually by the King. The people referred to him as *Il-Hakem*. He was assisted by four jurats. The Gozo Universitas was independent from that of Malta.

With the establishment of the Gozo Commune, the old town of Gozo situated on the fortified hill in the centre of the island became to be known as *Terra Gaudisii*.

The First Banca Giuratale

The building where the Universitas met was called the Banca Giuratale. The first Banca Giuratale was situated within the old fortified town on the hill. Dr Joseph Bezzina thinks that most probably it was situated on the same spot where later on the Palace of the Gozo Courts was built, now in Cathedral Square. However, it is to be pointed out that in 1409, the jurats were still looking for adequate premises as they requested a hall in the old *Castrum Gaudisii* or fortified tower within the same town; thus probably was sited where the Norman House is now to be found

in Melite Bernardo Street. At that time the jurats' request was turned down, most probably because lack of space. We also know that by 1442 this old Castrum was almost in ruins. So the jurats might as well by that time had acquired a hall or two in the same building but at the side of the Governor's Palace, in Zanca Street. This is only the opinion of the present writer and has still

to be verified by further research work.

In 1551 the position of Captain of the Rod for the Gozo Commune was abolished and instead the Order started to appoint a Governor for Gozo who was always a knight. The first one was Galacian de Sesse', under whose ill-fated governorship Gozo suffered its disastrous siege.

The jurats continued to function from the town up to 1661 when they occupied a 'new' Banca Giuratale at It-Tokk, in Rabat, that is at the main square, which was of the town's suburb.

Now at the western side of the main square there was an arcade, a type of a roofed passageway that served both as a sheltered marketplace and a meeting spot. In view of its threatening to collapse, Grand Master Martin de Redin (1657-60) ordered its restoration but nothing of the sort took place. So Grand Masters Annet Clermont de Chattes Gessan (1660) and Raphael Cotoner (1661-1663) had to issue similar orders. The necessary works were at last carried out in 1661 during the time of the Governor of Gozo Joseph del Vaso y Agreda of the Priory of Navarra. These works consisted of the restructuring of the passageway and the raising of some rooms upon it to serve as offices of the *Universitas*.

stamp terms used in PHILATELY (32)

- Nanking: The southern capital of China, the seat of the Japanese sponsored "puppet" government prior to and during World War II. It issued a lot of sets of postage stamps.
- *Naphthadog:* Great Britain Graphite Line issues were at first known by this name. This is a description of the substance used for the graphite line stamps.
- Napur: Perforating Machine: This machine was constructed on the Archer's principle at a cost of £400 each by Somerset House. First 1d stamps, perforated 16, coming from these machines, were issued on January 29, 1854. (a detailed check list appears on page 100 of Todd's 'History of British Postage Stamps'). They were made by David Napier & Sons in Lambert.
- Naples (Napoli): It issued stamps from January 1, 1858 when it was a kingdom. In 1860 King Ferdinand was driven out by Garibaldi and his volunteers, union with Sardinia was followed by an issue for the Neopolitan Provinces, bearing the head of the king of Sardinia. There were numerous forgeries. Pemberton says that the genuine stamps have a tiny letter engraved under the value.
- *Nashville:* Here Confederates Postmasters issued stamps during the Civil War.



Natal: Former British colony, now part of the republic of South Africa. Its first issues of 1857-58, were unique being embossed in plain relief of coloured papers. Stamps of Natal were superseded by those of South Africa in 1913.

Nationalist China: see Formosa.

- National Philatelic Society: This is the name of the British Philatelic Society. Formerly it was the Junior Philatelic Society.
- Nations Unies Office Europeen: O/P on modern stamps of Switzerland indicates use by the office of the United Nations in Europe.
- *Nativas:* French Colonial keytypes design for postage dues showing two native heads, one on either side of the value panel.
- *Nauranagar:* Former Indian Native State which issued its own internal stamps from 1875 to 1895.
- Naya Paisa: Indian currency unit introduced in 1957. 100n.p is equal to 1 rupee.
- Neopolitan Provinces: A transitory administration, absorbing Naples and being later (1862) incorporated into the kingdom of Italy. Stamps were issued bearing the embossed head of Victor Emanuele II; from February 1861 to March 1862.

POST HASTE (12)

continuing an irregular series about the interesting Story of the Post


Just Two of Australia's neighbours

Norfolk Island was first settled in 1788 as part of New South Wales but was later abandoned, with the settlers being provided with land in what was later to become Tasmania. In 1826 it became a penal settlement; following further vicissitudes, it became part of the Commonwealth of Australia in 1914. The commandant's clerk had been acting as garrison postmaster in 1832 but eight years later a civil one was appointed and handstamps provided. In the second half of the century, mail was irregular and very few items have actually survived.

New Zealand comprises two main islands (simply called North and South), together with smaller territories. British settlers began appearing in the early nineteenth century. In 1839 the New Zealand Company was formed, acquiring land from the native Maoris. Though there was no official PO until 1840, regular communication had been established in 1831 with Sydney – which acted as the forwarding office for overseas mail in both directions. As letters had to be held for the first available ship, many delays occurred.

By 1843 the increase in the number of POs led to the decision that the Controlling Office be moved to Auckland. A series of overland routes were established - but the terrain and the difficult relations with the natives meant that the sea was deemed more reliable: going from Auckland to Wellington (via Sydney) could take three months! It was not until 1878 that the railway link between these two main towns was completed.

Stamps were first issued in 1855 and three years later the Post Office Act regularized rates throughout this colony. Various attempts were made by New Zealand to establish services with Britain: by 1930, mail was being



carried by sea to Karachi to connect with the London flight. The Trans-Tasman service began in 1934 and a little later NZ was included in the "Empire all-up" service.

Three final facts:

- During the two World Wars, troops serving in various countries had special postmarks and Field POs.
- The uninhabited Auckland Islands issued two unauthorized stamps in 1915: though without postal validity, some were accepted by the NZ post office.
- A pigeon post was established in 1897 for communication between Great Barrier Island and the mainland and operated for over ten years.





The 'new' Banca Giuratale

It appears that this first *Banca Giuratale* at Rabat was not quite adequate for the needs of the Governor and the Jurats of the Gozo *Univeristas*. So after the elapse of eighty years they obtained the permission of Grand Master Manoel de Vilhena (1722-1736) and built another *Banca*, with a modern architectural baroque façade on the design of Francois de Mondion, Military engineer.

The new building had two floors, with two rooms at ground floor and two rooms at first floor that could be reached by a staircase. The new *Banca Giuratale* had a very ornamental façade surmounted by a huge stone octagonal cross of the Order of St. John. Mounted on the lower arm of the cross there were two marble escutcheons, the emblem of the Order of St. John on the left and the coat of arms of Grand

Master de Vilhena on the right. On each side of this emblem there were two other escutcheons, the coat of arms of Pablo Antonio de Viguier on the left and that of Despuig, the seneschal, on the right.

This imposing building was inaugurated by Pablo Antonio de Viguier, Governor of Gozo (1772-1774), in 1733, as attested by the following inscription:



The Gozo *Universitas* continued to hold its meeting inside this building until 1818, when it was suppressed by the British Governor of Malta Sir Thomas Maitland.

A Semicircular Addition

Under the British rule the building housed several Government Departmental Offices. Due to the limited space in 1875 it was enlarged by a semicircular addition designed by Architect Giovanni Bonello. The 1733 inscription was incorporated in the new façade over the main door and the

escutcheons were incorporated in the cornice of the new building.

Some of the Government Departments which at one time were housed in this building

included the following: the Notarial Archives, the Post Office, the Police Station, the Health Office, the First Telephone Exchange, the Department of Agriculture, the Information Department and currently the Culture Office.

From 1961 to 1973, the upper rooms housed the Gozo Civic Council and since 1994 it serves as premises of the Victoria Local Council




