The bars, cafes, dance halls and restaurants of Strait Street were a magnet for visiting servicemen during WW2. It was a vibrant hub of entertainment, featuring artistes from abroad (like the African-American dancer Levy Wine and his Spanish wife Dorothy) alongside popular local stars like the female impersonators 'Bobby' and 'Sugar Ocello', and contortionist 'The Sparrow'.





TIMELINE FOR MALTA'S WAR

- Malta's 'greater siege' lasted two years, five months, one week and two days.
- On the very first day, six members of the Royal Malta Artillery were killed at Fort St Elmo, and six Maltese naval personnel in Grand Harbour. In addition, eleven civilians were killed and 130 were injured.
- The island experienced over 3,300 air raids, with almost 1,500 occurring between January and June 1942.
- Malta holds the unenviable record for enduring WW2's heaviest and most sustained period of bombing – lasting 154 consecutive days and nights.
- King George VI awarded the George Cross to Malta on 15 April 1942. 75 years ago.
- By the end of April 1942, 85% of the houses in Floriana, and 75% of those in Valletta, had either been destroyed or damaged.
- Civilian casualties totalled over 5,300. Of those killed, 433 were women and 404 were children.
- The Free French: While most members of the French military accepted the terms of the 1940 Armistice, some like 19-year old Jacques Méhaus, mentioned in the play escaped from occupied France and joined Allied fighting units. After the Allied landings in North Africa in 1943, many former Vichy French units also joined the Allies.
- Throughout Malta's war, all fighter and anti-aircraft defences were controlled by No 8 Sector Operations Centre, Royal Air Force Lascaris.
- On 4 June 1943, King George VI awarded the British Empire Medal to six ladies of Lascaris: Miss Irene
 Arnold, Miss Irene Cameron, Mrs Marigold Fletcher, Mrs Phyllis Frederick, Miss Carmela Galea and Miss
 Christina Ratcliffe.


