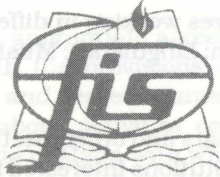
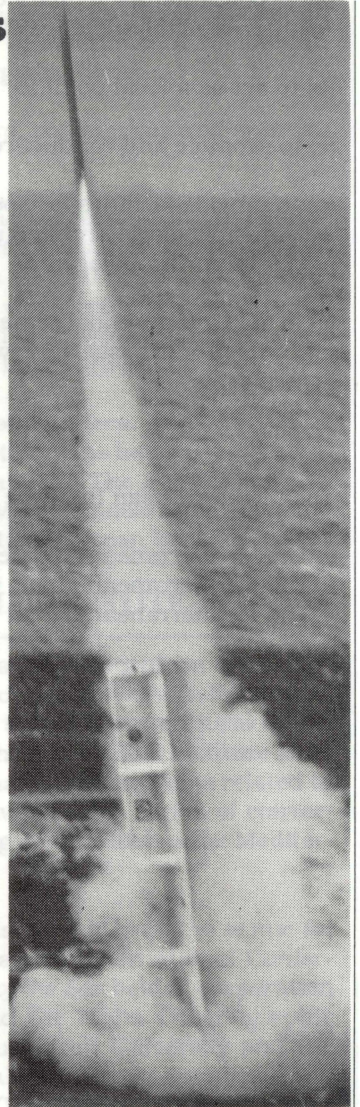

The two photos show the launching of the Friendship Rocket and Science Atelier held on July 29, 1987, at the Martin Luther King Hall, White Rocks, Malta.

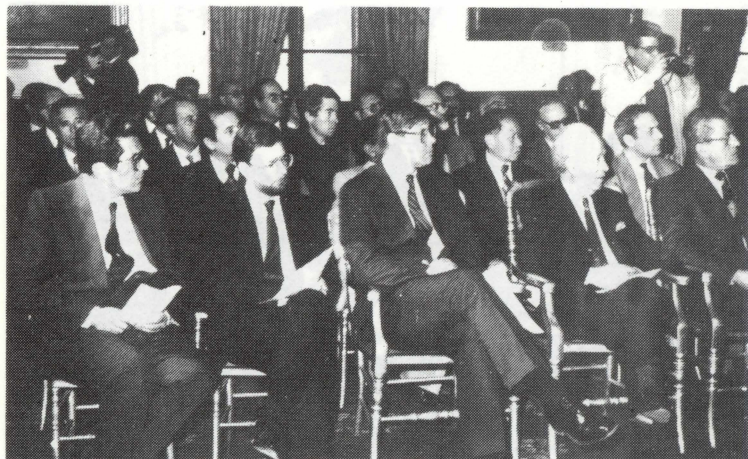
