



Sehem is-Soċjetà fit-Tieni Gwerra Dinjija

L-ewwel attakki mill-qawwiet tal-ajru Taljani nhar l-10 ta' Ĝunju tal-1940 li kienu jfissru l-miġja tat-Tieni Gwerra Dinjija f'Malta, ġabu bidliet soċjali kbar. Il-każini tal-baned ma kinux eċċeżzjoni u matul l-eqvel snin tal-gwerra l-attività mużikali waqfet kompletament, kemm minħabba li l-festi kellhom jitħassru u fuq kollox minħabba l-fatt li f'dawk iċ-ċirkostanzi kien hemm prioritatiet oħra.

Madankollu l-każini tal-banda xorta baqgħu jaqdu numru ta' funzjonijiet, fosthom is-Soċjetà tagħna.

Fis-sajf tal-1940 meta l-attakki fuq Malta kien battew xi ftit, il-biżgħha kienet li l-Imperu Ingliz, li kien l-aħħar bastjun tad-demokrazija fl-Ewropa, ukoll kien se jaqa' taħt il-ħakma Nażista. Quddiem sitwazzjoni bħal din il-poplu Malti, kif ngħidu ma ħarix sal-ponta ta' mneħħru u pprova jagħmel il-parti tiegħu wkoll.

Fost id-diversi inizjattivi li kienu ttieħdu kien hemm dawk li jingħabru flus biex tingħata għajjnuna lill-poplu ta' Londra waqt il-Battle of Britain. Fost l-oħrajn kienu saħansitra gew regalati żewġ ambulanzi li fuqhom kellhom imnaqqax isem Malta, biex jassistu l-feruti f'Londra.

Inizjattiva oħra kienet dik tal-Malta Mobile Canteen (London) Fund. L-iskop ta' din l-inizjattiva kien li tingħata għajjnuna finanzjarja lil dawk li kellhom xi propjetà, qraba, tħbieb jew xi konnessjoni oħra mal-kapitali tal-Imperu, biex jinxraw mobile canteens għall-popolazzjoni li hekk kif il-Battle of Britain kienet fl-eqvel tagħha, bl-attakki mill-ajru ma jaqtgħu xejn lejl u nhar.

Il-popolazzjoni kienet imheġġa biex tikkontribwixxi u b'hekk tagħti l-kontribut tagħha fil-gwerra. Fil-ħarġa tat-Times of Malta tat-13 ta' Novembru tal-1940 fil-lista li l-ġurnal kien jippubblika regolarmen bil-kontributuri ta' dan il-fond kien hemm is-Soċjetà Mużikali San Ġużepp tal-Hamrun li kienet ħarġet is-somma ta' £5.

Għalkemm din tidher somma redikola għaż-żminnijiet tal-lum, dan ma kienx il-kas. Biżżejjed ngħidu li Scicluna's Bank kien offrew £10-10-0d u Żejtun Band Club kienu ġabru £2-2-0d.



B'kollox sa nofs Novembru tal-1940 kienet ingabret is-somma ta' £1,343 li kienet intbagħtet lis-Segretarju tal-Istat għall-Kolonji mill-Gvernatur ta' Malta l-Ġeneral Dobbie li kien bagħat dan il-messaġġ:

"I have pleasure in informing you that the sum of £1,343 has been subscribed by the people of Malta for the provision of some Mobile Canteens to serve the sufferers in London, and that this sum is being forwarded to you through the Crown Agents for the Colonies.

The gift is offered not only as a token of admiration for the indomitable spirit shown by the people of London which has thrilled the whole world but also in understanding sympathy from a people who have also suffered, even though in a lesser degree, from similar attacks. It is hope that the Canteens thus provided will be a help and comfort to our fellow-sufferers in London, and that the name Malta inscribed on the Canteens will remind Londoners of a small country which can understand from experience something of their ordeal and sympathise with them."

ITALIANS EVACUATING ALBANIAN H.Q. OF KORITZA

As Greeks Advance, Women and Children gather Booty

R.A.F. DIVE-BOMBS ITALIAN COLUMN — TROOPS RUN LIKE HARES

THE ENCIRCLEMENT OF THE ALBANIAN HEADQUARTERS OF THE ITALIAN FORCES HAS NOW GONE SO FAR ACCORDING TO OUR SOURCES THAT THE QUESTION IS NO LONGER WHETHER BUT WHEN IT WILL BE TAKEN, BUT WHEN IT WILL BE TAKEN.

At the end of three weeks of war the Italians are now reported to be evacuating the town. A large column of lorries and cars has been seen today (8A, urday), on the Valona road, leading West from Koritza. Needless to say, this column has been effectively bombed. Another road leading to Koritza was out to lay, while the 6,000 ft. peak, from which Koritza can be bombarded, has been captured.

Anxious to take every ounce of profit from the present Italian ineffectiveness, Greek troops along the whole of the 12-mile front have taken "speed" as their watchword, even though it means open defiance of the enemy. Thus all frontier posts, including the capture of additional Italian troops and material is reported in a last minute consciousness which states that important fighting is taking place to the East of the Epirus, where many prisoners, trench mortars and all kinds of materiel have been taken. The Italians here have retreated on mass and the Greeks are advancing so rapidly that they have had no time to collect large booty which women and children are gathering.

GREEK BOOTY :

Evans are moving swiftly in Albania, but up to a late hour last night the Greeks were officially claiming captured:

- 2,000 prisoners;
- 20 heavy guns, mostly T.2s;
- 20 trench mortars;
- 100 anti-aircraft guns;
- 257 light machine-guns;
- 100 anti-tank weapons;
- 1,013 rifles;
- 287 motor lorries, loaded with rifles, anti-aircraft guns, anti-personnel bombs, 2,736 shells and 378 bombs;
