

MAGNIFICENT BUTTERFLY MACHAON

The Swallowtail was one of the first butterflies that were described by Carl Linnaeus in the 10th edition of Systema



Naturae in 1758 and named Papilio machaon, a figure in Greek mythology. Papilio machaon has a striking coloration of black on top of a yellow base color. There are blue and red spots on the hind wings. A mutation or variation on Swallowtails' natural color is the occasional butterfly that displays melanism, a black coloration on the wings, rather than yellow. Also there are butterflies of blue color. There are fairly large butterflies compared to most others. The Swallowtails have two overlapping wings, which create a wing span anywhere from

5.5 - 8 cm in length. Some females even have a fore-wing span that reaches

beyond 10 cm. This butterfly is present throughout the entire Palearctic region, ranging from Russia to China and Japan, (including the Himalayas and Taiwan). and across into Alaska, Canada, and the




United States. In Asia, it is reported as far south as Saudi Arabia, Oman, the high mountains of Yemen, Lebanon, Iran and Israel. In southern Asia, it occurs in Pakistan and Kashmir, northern India, Nepal, Bhutan, and northern Myanmar. Papilio machaon inhabits alpine meadows in the Himalayas occurring from 2,000 feet (610 m) in Kashmir valley to 16.000 feet (4,900 m) in the Garhwal Himalayas. emergence of many subspecies of Machaon. There are 37 recognized subspecies of this butterfly.





Throughout most of it's range the Swallowtail shows itself to be highly adaptable, utilising a wide variety of habitats including sub-arctic tundra in Canada, prairies, woodlands and arid canyons in the south of the USA; hay meadows, roadside verges, river banks and sub-alpine pastures in Europe; high montane habitats in the Atlas mountains of north Africa, and semi-cultivated habitats in the Mediterranean area. The butterfly has a characteristic powerful gliding flight, and is

pink flowers of angelica, knapweeds, marsh thistles, red campion, ragged robin and valerian. When nectaring they keep their wings constantly fluttering to prevent the weight of their bodies from dragging down on the fragile flowers. Like all butterflies, the Swallowtails can be effective pollinators. The flight of Swallowtails is characterized by the strong flapping of their wings during the months of May and June.

The butterflies of the north have one flight sometime in May through July while those of the south have two flights. Pupae of machaon, attached to the stalk of a herbaceous plant or shrub, hibernate near the ground and only in May of them appear butterflies. They lay eggs, caterpillars feed and in the beginning of August

the second generation of butterflies comes out. They lay eggs, caterpillars pupate in September, pupae winter and ... further in a circle.


Butterfly Machaon is one of the most magnificent insects. It is distinguished by a chic multi-colored color. At the same time, the shape of the butterfly's wings is unusually beautiful. This is one of the most elegant butterflies in Europe. In view of their scarcity, butterflies

do not cause any damage to agriculture and need protection. Butterfly Papilio machaon is protected by law in six provinces of Austria, Czech Republic, Slovakia, Hungary, Romania, and in the United Kingdom. The species are listed in the national Red Books of Ukraine, Moldova, Lithuania, Latvia, and Germany.

Aesthetically butterflies Papilio machaon are unique and therefore by spectacular appearance the popularity of the butterfly in human society has become very great. «Perho» (Butterfly) was a paint product family name of the Finnish company «Suomen Väri- ja Vernissa Tehdas Oy». The company used firm meter mark with stylized butterfly


Butterfly Machaon is so popular that it is depicted on the coat of arms of Skrudalienas volost (small rural district) of Latvia. Subspecies Papilio machaon melitensis is the largest butterfly in the Maltese Islands. The race occurring locally is endemic, that is, it is not found anywhere else. In the not so distant past it was much common but like most



MALTA – THE GREEN CROSS LABEL SCHEME 1940 - 43 The R.A.F. Air mail service to the Island

After the fall of France and the entry of Italy into the war, the Governor and C. in C. of Malta complained of the inadequate air mail service to the Island which was having a serious effect on the morale of British Forces

A few Sunderland flying boats had made the trip in the past few weeks but these had carried high priority material and were unable to include mail in their cargo.

It was proposed by the R.A.F., in liaison with the Post Office, that three Wellingtons of No. 24 (Communications) Squadron at Hendon, should be used to provide a weekly outward and homeward service and should carry 100 lbs of private mail addressed to service personnel at Malta.

The Post Office printed small, oblong labels bearing a green St. Andrews Cross of "one ounce" type on 3rd August 1940 and "half ounce" type on 5th November 1940. These were sent to Malta and distributed to Servicemen for enclosure with their mail home, then to be used on return letters which would be sent by the short air route to Malta.

It was designed to ensure that the very limited space which was available for mails on the few aircrafts which operated direct between the United Kingdom and Malta was devoted to the carrying of letters not exceeding half ounce in weight addressed to troops and civilians from their friends in this country.

The prepaid postage on a Green Cross letter was 2½d when addressed to a civilian and 1½d when addressed to members of H.M. Forces.

Secrecy was essential and correspondents were asked not to use "By Air Mail" labels – they often did! The G.P.O. also denied 'postal significance' for the labels and refused to answer enquiries about the scheme at Post Office counters. The scheme was a success and, although due to enemy presence, it is doubtful whether the once weekly average was achieved, mail which had previously flown on the UK – Lisbon – Gold Coast (Ghana) – Cairo route and had been subject to very long delays, reached Malta quickly.

With an improvement in the British military and naval situation, the scheme ceased to operate on 1st October 1943.

THE GREEN CROSS LABEL



When the siege of Malta became so severe that it was difficult to maintain the mail services a new air mail service was arranged. Each soldier was given one green cross label per week. This he sent home to his relatives and they put it on the front of the reply letter. Letters bearing these labels were flown to Malta by special fast planes. All others went via the Cape, taking over two months instead of a few days. Very few such letters bearing labels have survived.

Types of Green Cross label

First type showing St Andrew's Cross in deep olive green ink with inscription "Weight/not to exceed one ounce" ordered on 29th July 1940 and available for dispatch on 3rd August. When it was later decided that one ounce was too heavy for letters a number of the printed one ounce labels were altered by hand to read "½ ounce".







Second type in light green ink with inscription "Weight/not to exceed half ounce" ordered on 23rd October 1940 and available for dispatch on 5th November.

There were at least two printings of this label - sans serif lettering and serif.







Third type with no inscription printed in many different shades and colours from apple green to deep blue green and thin to thick lines used from July 1941.

A few of these labels were also altered in manuscript to read "Not exceeding ½ oz" or "Not more than ½ oz."

As printing was from several different plates, many of them being more or less defective, various flaws and varieties showed up on the resulting labels.



Cover posted on 8 May 1943 from Norwich to a serviceman in Malta Franked with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ d GB stamp being the civilian air rate, with the machine cancellation tying also the Green Cross label Received by addressee on 18.5.43 as per manuscript on the back

The Green Cross label from the third printing has an unusual green horizontal bar along its upper margin

The use of a Green Cross label on mail other than from U.K. is most unusual

Fourth type was hand-drawn labels in green ink drawn on the envelopes and the very few examples known made their appearance from December 1942 to February 1943.



The above mark was copied from the original hand stamp

A Post Office circular issued on 13 October 1943 sets out the arrangement for the issuing of a refund where postage was prepaid for an air mail service that no longer existed

Two types of handstamps, in violet were introduced



1943 (17 October) On Active Service cover posted in U.K franked 5d in G.B stamps and having the air mail label cancelled by five violet horizontal bars. Two other violet handstamps also applied;

"1/3 PER ½OZ AIR MAIL LETTER SERVICE NOT AVAILABLE"







POSTAL DIARY 7TH FEBRUARY 2018 – 20TH JUNE 2018

07th February

MaltaPost announced that on the 9th February it will issue a set of three stamps depicting Traditional Maltese Costumes.

Daily life in early modern Maltese history was very much dependent on economic traits, mainly divided in two distinct spheres. The Grand Harbour area was centred on maritime activity which along various centuries was fuelled by trade, industry, strategic importance and wartime replenishment to generate years of considerable prosperity. The rest of the archipelago remained heavily reliant on agriculture up to the mid-twentieth century. This dichotomy finds its imprint in dress, since like all other forms of art, costumes reflect the society which produces them.

The stamps will be issued in sheets of 10 stamps. Each stamp measures 44mm x 31mm, and has a perforation of 13.9x 14.0 (comb.) bearing the Maltese Crosses watermark. The sheets measure 185mm x 118mm. Printex Limited produced the set in offset and the issue consists of 700,000 of the €0.26 stamp, 300,000 of the €0.59 stamp and 80,000 of the €1.16 stamp.

The three photographs of the different attires, faithful reproductions sewn by Alda Bugeja, are courtesy of Heritage Malta.

MaltaPost prepared an occasion postmark to cancel the stamps on the first day of issue (on FDC No.1/2018). The single severed-ring handstamp is inscribed




14th February

MaltaPost will be participating in the Stampex stamp f air to be held in London between the 14th and 17th February 2018. The stamp fair is an annual event where

international postal operators showcase their philatelic items. MaltaPost's Philatelic Bureau will be participating in this fair with a variety of Maltese stamps related to various popular themes.

For this event, the Philatelic Bureau will issue an Occasion Card (Number 49) and a Personalised Stamp/Cover featuring the exhibition logo. MaltaPost also prepared an occasion postmark for use during the duration of the event. The single severed-ring handstamp is inscribed "STAMPEX



INTERNATIONAL FAIR" along the outside bordering the ring and "* MALTAPOST – PHILATELIC BUREAU - MALTA *" on the lower inner side of the ring. The words "JUM IL-ĦRUĠ/14-17.02.18" in straight lines are to be found below an outline image depicting the fair's logo positioned at the top centre of the handstamp. It is strange how the words JUM IL-ĦRUĠ (Day of Issue) have been incorporated in the handstamp which does not relate to a single day but covers a period of four days!

15th February

MaltaPost informed the public of the temporary closure of two Sub Post Offices.

On this day, customers were advised to use the postal services provided from the following Post Offices:

- Luqa Post Office situated at 11, Trejqa Dun Ġulju Muscat, Ħal Luqa LQA 1450
- Żurrieq Post Office situated at 8, Triq Santa Katerina, iż-Żurrieq ŻRQ 1088

The Sub Post Office, "Aquavel", Triq San Bartilmew, Gharghur, GHR 1014 will be closed between Friday 9^{th} and Monday 12^{th} February 2018.

During this period, the public was advised to use the postal services provided from Naxxar Post Office situated at the Civic Centre, 21st September Avenue, Naxxar NXR 1018 as a close alternative.

19th February

MaltaPost informed the public that the Sub Post Office at Iklin Stationery, 89, Čensu Busuttil Street, IKLIN IKL 1202 will no longer operate as Sub Post Office as from Monday 19th February 2018 as it will be closed permanently.

As an alternative, residents in the area were advised to use postal services provided from Naxxar Post Office situated at the Civic Centre, 21st September Avenue, Naxxar NXR 1018.

07th March

MaltaPost informed the public that the Sub Post Office at 'Alessio Old Cottage', 12, Triq il-Parrocca, L-Imqabba MQB 1511 will be temporarily closed between Monday 12th and Sunday 25th March 2018.

During this period Mqabba residents have been requested to collect their mail from Żurrieq Post Office situated at 8, Triq Santa Katerina, iż-Żurrieq ŻRQ 1088.

15th March

Today MaltaPost notified that a special hand postmark for the occasion of the Episcopal Ordination of H.E. Mons. Alfred Xuereb, will be issued on Saturday 17th March 2018 at the Victoria Post Office, Gozo.

23rd April

In today's media communication, MaltaPost announced that on 3rd May 2018 it will join other European postal administrations by the release of a stamp set bearing the theme "Bridges".

EUROPA stamps underline cooperation between European postal administrations and seek to promote philately and build awareness of the common goals, roots, culture and history of Europe.


This issue features two bridges, The Madliena Bridge in Hal Gharghur and the Grand Harbour breakwater bridge. Both bridges were built when Malta was under British Rule.

The €0.59 stamp features the Madliena Bridge, also known as the Wied id-Dis Bridge, built in 1880 by the British military forces to facilitate transportation of military equipment and also servicemen along the Victoria Lines. The €2.19 stamp depicts the Grand Harbour Breakwater Bridge also known as the St. Elmo Bridge. Photographs used as the basis for the stamps are by David P. Attard.

The stamps will be issued in two sheetlets each bearing 11 stamps. Each stamp measures $44 \text{mm} \times 31 \text{mm}$, has a $13.9 \times 14.0 \text{ (comb.)}$ perforation bearing the Maltese Crosses watermark. The sheetlets measure $158 \text{mm} \times 150 \text{mm}$. The stamps were produced by Printex Ltd in the offset process and the issue consists of 35,200 of the 0.59 stamp and 0.59 stamp.

This stamp set will be Malta's entry for the '2018 EUROPA Online Stamp Contest'. The contest is an annual online event where creative entries from across Europe compete for the best design.

The words "JUM IL-ĦRUĠ/03-05.05.18" in straight lines are to be found below an outline image depicting the fair's logo positioned at the top centre of the handstamp. It



is quite strange to note that the words "JUM IL-ĦRUĠ" (First Day of Issue) were included in the hand stamp which is covering a period of three days.

The coin, struck at the Royal Dutch Mint, shows the emblem of Malta and the year of issue 2018 on the obverse. On the reverse it carries a personification of Valletta, a fortress city, represented as a woman wearing armour. The silver foil stamp replica and the coin will be available both as a set in one presentation case, or in separate presentation case format. The coin has a face value of €10. It is struck in proof quality in 0.925 silver, has a weight of 28.28 grams and a diameter of 38.61 mm. The mintage is limited to 2,000 coins. The coin was designed and engraved by Noel Galea Bason.

The silver replica stamp was also produced for MaltaPost by the Royal Dutch Mint and depicts the €0.26 postage stamp from the 'Valletta 2018 European Capital of Culture' stamp issue.


