
Xaghra


'Zeppi' Grech who worked at Xaghra windmill was a jack of all trades making everything from mousetraps to ploughs. He most likely turned his wooden pipe (fig.1) and carved the globigerina limestone pipes which were found with his effects (figs.2, 3).



He also made his own leather tobacco pouch with a handy metal spike to pick the pipes clean

This French pipe was found at Xaghra windmill during work to restore the building.

There was a large Maltese community in Marseilles in the 19th century.
