

Xaghra

'Zeppi' Grech who worked at Xaghra windmill was a jack of all trades making everything from mousetraps to ploughs. He most likely turned his wooden pipe (fig.1) and carved the *globigerina* limestone pipes which were found with his effects (figs.2, 3).

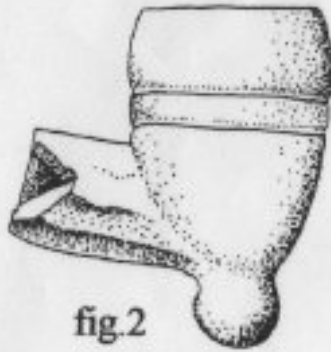

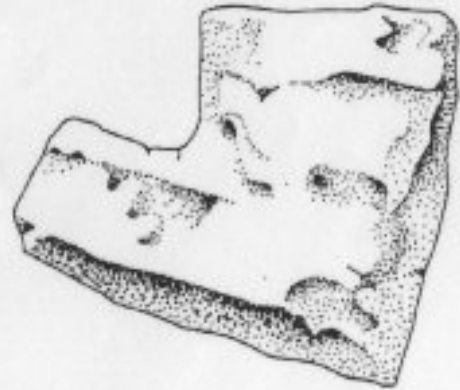
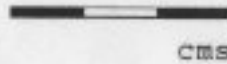


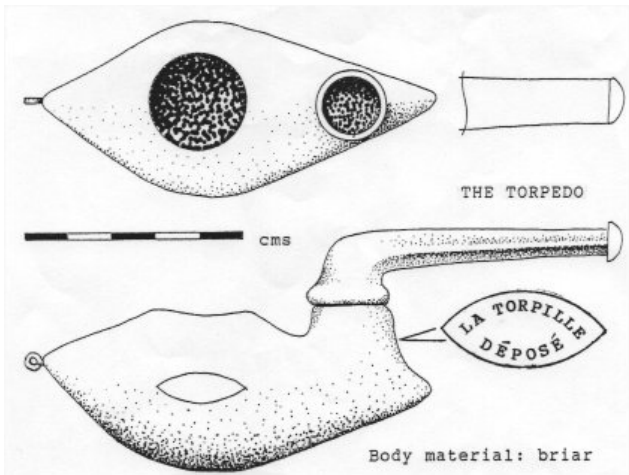
