In this paper, \mathbf{i} , \mathbf{j} are unit vectors along the x - and y - axes of a Cartesian system.

(take $g = 10 \text{ ms}^{-2}$)

- $PQRS$ is a square. Forces of 5 N, 2 N, 3 N, 1 N and F N act along \overrightarrow{PQ} , \overrightarrow{RQ} , \overrightarrow{RS} , \overrightarrow{PS} and \overrightarrow{SQ} respectively in the direction indicated by the order of the letters.

 - Find F if the system reduces to a single force through P . (6)
 - For this value of F , find the magnitude of the resultant and the angle it makes with PQ . (4)

- A mass of 3 kg is attached to two elastic strings AB and BC at B . The string AB is fixed at A and string BC is fixed at C , 2.50 m vertically below A . The strings AB and AC have natural lengths of 0.75 m and 0.50 m and modulus of elasticity, λ of 30 N and 10 N respectively. The mass is in equilibrium. Find the final lengths of strings AB and BC . (10)

3. A uniform rod AB of mass 8 kg and length 4 m rests with A on a smooth horizontal ground and B on a smooth peg 2 m above the ground. The rod is held in this position by a horizontal force P at A . Find:

- a) the magnitude of the force P ; (6)
- b) the magnitude of the reactions at A and B . (4)

4. A square $ABCD$ of side 3 cm, and uniform density of 2g cm^{-2} is placed with point A at the origin. Sides AB and AD are placed on the x - and y - axis respectively. A square $DEFG$ of side 1 cm of density 3g cm^{-2} is glued on the square $ABCD$. Both sheets have the same thickness.

- a) Find the position of the overall centre of gravity. (7)
- b) The resulting lamina is suspended at the point A . Find the angle AD makes with the vertical. (3)

5. A car is moving at a speed $u\text{ ms}^{-1}$. The brakes of the car can produce a constant retardation of 6 ms^{-2} . When the driver decides to stop, s/he has a reaction time of $\frac{2}{3}\text{ s}$ before the brakes are applied. As the car passes a point A the driver decides to stop.

- a) Show that the minimum distance of the car from A when the car comes to rest is given by:

$$\frac{u}{12} (u + 8). \quad (6)$$

The driver is approaching the traffic lights and is 90 m from the traffic lights when the lights change from green to amber. The light remains amber for 3 s before changing to red. Find:

- b) the speed u ; (2)
- c) the time the lights have been red before the car comes to a stop. (2)

6. An elastic string has one end fixed to a point A . The other end B , which is attached to a particle of mass 3 kg is pulled vertically down from A until AB is 3.0 m and then released. The modulus of elasticity of the string is 50 N and the natural length is 1.2 m.

- a) Using the principle of conservation of energy, find the velocity of the particle when the string first becomes slack. (7)
- b) Find the distance from A of the particle when it first comes to rest. (3)

7. A small block of mass 4 kg moves 6 m up a rough slope inclined at an angle of 25° to the horizontal by means of a light inextensible string which passes over a frictionless pulley at the top of the slope. The coefficient of friction of the mass and slope is 0.25. A mass of 7 kg is hanging vertically freely on the other side of the string. The system is released from rest. Find:
- a) the frictional force acting on the 4 kg mass; (3)
 - b) the acceleration up the slope of the 4 kg mass; (2)
 - c) the tension in the string; (3)
 - d) the time taken for the 4 kg block to move 6 m up the slope, assuming that the block does **not** reach the pulley. (2)

8. Two particles *A* and *B* of masses $2m$ and m , respectively, are moving towards each other with velocities u and $3u$ respectively. The collision is perfectly inelastic. Find:
- a) the final velocity; (5)
 - b) loss of kinetic energy. (5)

9. A car of mass 900 kg is travelling around a circular bend of radius 40 m. The coefficient of friction between the tyre and road is 0.4.
- a) If the bend is unbanked, find the maximum safe speed in km/hr to prevent slipping outwards. (4)
 - b) The road is now banked at 20° to the horizontal. Find the new maximum safe speed for the new construction to prevent slipping outwards. (6)

10. A particle is projected at an angle θ with a velocity of 28 ms^{-1} and is to hit a target 64 m away on the same horizontal level. Find:
- a) at time t , the horizontal and vertical distance travelled in terms of t and θ ; (3)
 - b) the trajectory equation of the particle; (4)
 - c) the **TWO** possible angles of projection. (3)
