If you use photographs, reproductions, illustrations, photocopies, art works, articles, etc., you must show how your work developed in a **PERSONAL WAY**.

You are EXPECTED to demonstrate that you have followed the above process. Failure to do so will make you lose marks.

All two-dimensional work should be submitted in a standard examination folder provided by MATSEC for the price of 1.16 euro. Only **ONE unaltered folder** may be used.

Three-dimensional work should be submitted in an adequate package **not exceeding** 50 cm x 50 cm x 50 cm.

You must indicate on the folder or package 'Project Work', your Index Number and the number of the Starting Point. YOUR NAME MUST NOT APPEAR IN ANY PART OF YOUR WORK.

You must provide your own model. The model should be dressed in plain, light coloured, casual attire. Spotted or patterned clothing are to be avoided.

The pose and setting are to be arranged by the supervisor.
