 - 10 Individually wrapped sterile adhesive dressings in various sizes
 - A suitable supply of sterile eye wash
 - 2 Sterile eye pads with attachment
- b. Demonstrate the correct procedure for a minor nose bleed.
- c. Demonstrate the correct procedure for an adult who is unconscious.
