1. What is the immediate context of this passage? (10)
2. Who is Agamemnon? What is the cause of his anxiety? (10)
3. Name the mood of βλέψον (l. 320) and of δείξω (l.324). (10)
4. What is Menelaus referring to by the word δέλτον (l. 322)? Why are its contents being referred to as κακίστων (l. 322)? (10)
5. Translate the first **THREE** lines of the passage (l. 317-319, from ἔα ... ἄγεις;). (10)

Read the following passage carefully and then answer ALL the questions set on it in English:

Μετὰ δὲ ταῦτα Τισσαφέρνης ἦλθεν εἰς Ἑλλάσποντον· ἀφικόμενον δὲ παρ' αὐτὸν μιᾷ τριήρει Ἀλκιβιάδην ξενία τε καὶ δῶρα ἄγοντα συλλαβὼν εἶρξεν ἐν Σάρδεσι, **φάσκων κελεύειν βασιλέα πολεμεῖν Ἀθηναίοις**. ἡμέραις δὲ τριάκοντα ὕστερον Ἀλκιβιάδης ἐκ Σάρδεων μετὰ Μαντιθέου τοῦ ἀλόντος ἐν Καρία ἵππων εὐπορήσαντες νυκτὸς ἀπέδρασαν εἰς Κλαζομενάς.

Οἱ δ' ἐν Σηστῷ Ἀθηναῖοι, **αἰσθόμενοι Μίνδαρον πλεῖν ἐπ' αὐτοὺς μέλλοντα** ναυσὶν ἐξήκοντα, νυκτὸς ἀπέδρασαν εἰς Καρδίαν. ἐνταῦθα δὲ καὶ Ἀλκιβιάδης ἤκεν ἐκ τῶν Κλαζομενῶν σὺν πέντε τριήρεσι καὶ ἐπακτρίδι. πυθόμενος δὲ ὅτι αἱ τῶν Πελοποννησίων νῆες ἐξ Ἀβύδου ἀνηγμένοι εἶεν εἰς Κύζικον, αὐτὸς μὲν περὶ ἦλθεν εἰς Σηστόν, τὰς δὲ ναῦς περιπλεῖν ἐκεῖσε ἐκέλευσεν.

1. Translate the following passage into English:**The Cyclops**

ὁ πόλεμος μακρὸς ἦν, ἀλλὰ μετὰ δέκα ἐνιαυτοὺς οἱ Ἀχαιοὶ τὴν Τροίαν ἔλαβον. μετὰ δὲ τὸν πόλεμον ὁ τ' Ὀδυσσεὺς καὶ οἱ ἐταῖροι μακρὰν ὁδὸν ἐν τοῖς πλοίοις ἔσχον. ἐν δὲ τῇ ὁδῷ κακὰ ἔπαθον· πολλάκις γὰρ εἰς κινδύνους ἔπιπτον. οἱ μὲν θεοὶ πολλάκις τοὺς κινδύνους ἔπεμπον· ὁ δ' Ὀδυσσεὺς αὐτὸς τοὺς ἐταίρους εἰς μέγιστον κίνδυνόν ποτε ἤγαγεν. ἦν νῆσος καλὴ καὶ ἐρήμη. δένδρα καλὰ ἐν τῇ νήσῳ ἦν, ἀλλ' οὔτ' οἰκίαι οὔθ' ἱερὰ οὔτ' ἄνθρωποι. ἀντὶ τῆς νήσου ἦν ἡ χώρα ἢ τῶν Κυκλώπων.

2. Read the following passage carefully and then answer ALL the questions set on it in English:

ὁ Πλάτων λέγει ὅτι Θαλῆς ὁ φιλόσοφος ἀστρονομῶν καὶ ἄνω βλέπων εἰς φρέαρ ἔπεσεν. θεράπεινα δέ τις εἶδεν αὐτὸν καὶ ἔσκωπεν· “σὺ ὑπὸ πάντων θαυμάζῃ ὡς φιλόσοφος κλεινὸς ὢν. ἀληθῶς μέντοι μωρὸς εἶ. τὰ μὲν γὰρ ἐν οὐρανῷ ἐθέλεις γινώσκειν, τὰ δὲ πρὸ τῶν ποδῶν οὐ γινώσκεις”. λέγει δὲ καὶ ὁ Πλάτων ὅτι πάντες οἱ φιλόσοφοι πάσχουσι τὸ αὐτό, ὥσπερ ὁ Θαλῆς. περὶ γὰρ τῶν ἀπόντων σπεύδουσι, τῶν δὲ παρόντων ἀμελοῦσιν. πολλάκις οὖν ὑπὸ τῶν πολιτῶν σκῶπτονται.

- c. Why did Thales' maidservant mock him? (5)
- d. Translate πολλάκις οὖν ὑπὸ τῶν πολιτῶν σκῶπτονται. (5)
- e. Give the case, number, gender and declension of ποδῶν. (5)
- f. Give the person, number, tense, mood and voice of σπεύδουσι. (5)

3. Translate the following extract into English:**Alexander's Ambition**

ὁ Ἀλέξανδρος ἐν τῇ διὰ τῆς ἐρημίας ὁδῷ πρὸς τὸ τοῦ Ἄμμωνος μαντεῖον ἦλθεν. τοῖς μὲν γὰρ τῶν ἀνθρώπων ὁ τῶν θεῶν βασιλεὺς καὶ πατὴρ Ζεὺς ἐστὶν ὀνόματι, τοῖς δὲ Ἄμμων ἢ ἄλλος τις. τὸ οὖν τοῦ Διὸς ὄνομα ἐν τῇ Λιβύῃ Ἄμμων ἐστίν. ἐπεὶ δὲ ὁ Ἀλέξανδρος πρὸς τὸ μαντεῖον ἦλθεν, ὁ ἱερεὺς, τὴν γλῶσσαν κακῶς μαθὼν, ἤθελεν Ἑλληνιστὶ λέγειν αὐτῷ “ὦ παῖδιον”. οὐ μέντοι “ὦ παῖδιον” ὀρθῶς εἶπεν, ἀλλ’ “ὦ παῖδιος”, ἀντὶ τοῦ νῦν τὸ σίγμα λέγων. ὁ δ’ Ἀλέξανδρος ἔχαιρε διότι ὁ ἱερεὺς, ὡς ἐπίστευεν, εἶπεν αὐτῷ “ὦ παῖ Διός”. ἐπεὶ οὖν ἐν τῷ πολέμῳ τῷ ἐπὶ τοὺς Πέρσας ὁ Ἀλέξανδρος νίκην ἔσχεν, ἐκέλευσε τοὺς στρατιώτας αὐτὸν ὡς θεὸν προσαγορεύειν. καὶ πολλοὶ τῶν ἐν τῷ στρατῷ ἐτοιμοὶ ἦσαν τὸν Ἀλέξανδρον οὕτως προσαγορεύειν. Λακεδαιμόνιος δὲ τις εἶπε μόνον, “εἰ ὁ Ἀλέξανδρος ἐθέλει θεὸς εἶναι, ἔστω θεός”.
