**Subject:** Changes in SEC 2022 syllabi

**Date:** 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2021

The MATSEC Board has been monitoring the COVID-19 situation in schools and the impact on the time required for delivery and assessment of its SEC syllabi.

Following completion of the exercise by each school sector mentioned in the communication of the 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2020, the MATSEC Board has re-convened all syllabus panels. Each subject panel discussed the outcome of the collection of data exercise from the respective sectors and proposed changes to the SEC 2022 syllabi to reflect the limitations caused by the pandemic, while ensuring that there would be enough time to deliver the remaining components of each subject.

This document outlines the changes in each subject. More details may be found in the respective syllabi.
