Which skills do you need ?

- No particular specific skills required except basic Mathematics
- A stronger background in mathematics is usually considered an asset in the industry but not essential
- Strong background in English oral and written
- Need to be curious and have an interest in following business news, and more particularly what and how things are done in real corporate life, etc.
- Willing to learn how to use specific software and databases
- Willingness to keep yourself updated with new developments even after you finish your course (this is now very important as most industries (not just finance) are fast changing)

Which careers can you follow ?

- According to the Labour Force Survey, the financial services sector is where wages are the highest (see slides 8 and 10)
- This sector is still expanding and has a lot of further growth potential
- Can work not only with banks but also:
- With investment companies
- Hedge funds
- Mutual funds
- One of the Big Four (EY, Deloitte, KPMG & PWC) + other auditing firms
- Regulators/Government agencies (see next slide)
- Possibility of working abroad as well

Today most new (additional) jobs are regulatory/compliance related

With government agencies MFSA, FIAU, Central Bank, MLRO, etc.....

And similar posts within regulated firms (banks, funds, insurance companies, brokers, etc.)

Which careers can you follow ?

- Most specialised professions in the banking and finance area are regulated and can only be performed by people with certain qualifications/experience
- If you want to perform certain professions, the only way is to get BFI degree and for certain professions a Masters in BFI is a minimum.


