WHEN TO APPLY

Applications for admission to courses commencing in October are typically accepted between December and July. However, late applications may be considered until the end of September, subject to late-application fees. For courses beginning in February, applications are generally accepted until mid-January. Late applications may also be considered, accompanied by a late-application fee. For precise deadlines, please reach out to the IRM Department. Early application enhances your prospects of securing a place and facilitates the necessary arrangements for your future studies.
