Procedure:

1. Decide on an area of study and attempt to formulate a research agenda and research approach
2. Identify a potential supervisor from the above list.
3. **AVOID contacting multiple potential supervisors at the same time as it WILL take up the space of another student.**
4. Make an appointment and meet with the supervisor. **ONCE you have a supervisor you CANNOT go “shopping” for other supervisors.**
5. If the individual you wish to supervise your dissertation is not on the list of approved supervisors and is not a member of staff within the Faculty of Social Wellbeing, you are required to discuss this in the first instance with the Dissertations Coordinator.
6. Secure a commitment to supervision and together with the supervisor, complete the Research Proposal Form.
7. Supervisors have two weeks to ANSWER emails and three weeks to CORRECT work.
8. **You can have two face-to-face (online) supervision sessions re the proposal and three face-to-face (online) supervision during the write-up of the dissertation. All other correspondences/queries should be addressed via email.**

9. If you have difficulties in your supervisory relationship – 1) you speak to your supervisor and if it is not resolved 2) discuss it with the dissertation coordinator.

Submission deadlines:

- Second Year B.Psy (Hons.) students: Please submit your Research Proposal to the Psychology Office by Monday 18th November 2024
- Higher Diploma in Psychology students: Please submit your Research Proposal to the Psychology Office by Monday 11th November 2024.

Please note that prospective supervisors can only be contacted via the work email available on the UoM website or the email provided by Ms Elena Mallia (Administrator, Department of Psychology). **Prospective supervisors should not be contacted via Facebook, LinkedIn, Messenger, WhatsApp, text message etc. Students are not to share prospective supervisors' email addresses with one another or on social media.**
