All the while, the Faculty for Social Wellbeing is rooted in a primary commitment to academic freedom and institutional autonomy, with care for staff and students as a top priority. In taking a visionary approach to education, research, and innovation, and by bringing these together to strengthen social wellbeing, the Faculty has proven itself a valuable pioneer for wellbeing in the Maltese society.
- In the run up to our **10**th **Anniversary**, the Faculty will be organising a number of special events to celebrate this day more on that soon.

- The Faculty for Social Wellbeing is providing training to candidates contesting the **General Elections** in the area of social wellbeing.
- Prof. Mary Anne Lauri (Department of Psychology) together with the Dean, Prof. Andrew Azzopardi continue to represent the Faculty on **Senate**.
- Dr Claire Azzopardi Lane (Deputy Dean and Head, Department of Disability Studies) has been appointed **Head, Department of Gender and Sexualities** to replace Dr Marceline Naudi (Department of Gender and Sexualities). Kudos to Dr Naudi for services rendered.

Ms Shirley Gilson (Faculty Office) together with Ms. Nicole Casha (Department of Disability Studies) are also acting as administrative support of FREC. - OROM is a Child Observatory that has been set up in conjunction with The Malta Trust Foundation and The Malta Foundation for the Wellbeing of Society in collaboration with the Faculty for Social Wellbeing and supported by the UM.
- The **Dean's Award ceremony** will be taking place on line (Facebook Live) due to Covid-19 pandemic restrictions.

- Societas.expert is in its third edition this time round focusing on 'intersectionality'.
- The 5th edition of **Unity**, the Faculty magazine, is at the printers.
- The **Dean's Forum** will be postponed to a later date due to Covid-19 pandemic restrictions.

- The Professorial-Senior Lecturers mentoring programme has been launched.
- Prof. Marilyn Clark (Department of Psychology) delivered a paper in the **Professorial Lecture Series**.
- Prof. Maureen Cole (Department of Social Policy and Social Work) and Prof. Joanne Cassar (Department of Youth and Community Studies) were promoted to Professor.
- 2 Ph.D. scholarships funded by CRPD have been issued and will shortly be awarded.
- 2 Ph.D. scholarships will be awarded in the area of addictions.
- Dr Ruth Falzon (Department of Counselling), Prof. Marilyn Clark (Department of Psychology) and the Dean, Prof. Andrew Azzopardi, have **edited the text**, 'Perspectives on Wellbeing: Applications from the Field' which will be published in the coming months.
- Work on the new plans is developing nicely by the UM Periti for the Faculty building.
- Apart from the **Vlog** and the **radio show** *Konnekt* we are also about to launch a **Podcast** that will be led by students of the Faculty. *More on this shortly*.
- We are working on launching new **Faculty merchandise** for this coming academic year.
- Faculty merchandise is also being sent to **secondary schools**.
- The main **Faculty corridor** is undergoing a revamp with the setting up of a number of murals to celebrate the run-up to the 10th Anniversary.
- Prof. Saviour Formosa (Department of Criminology) has once again submitted to the media a detailed Crimemalta annual report.
- Academic staff have submitted around 100 papers during this academic year.
- Various members of the academic body sit on Senate Committees and Joint Council/Senate committees.
- Dr Gianmarco Alberti delivered a session on quantitative research organised by the RSPC.
- The College of Heads, the Faculty Ph.D. Committee and the Faculty Board kept meeting regularly notwithstanding the pandemic. Their operations have temporarily been transferred on-line.
- The Ph.D. sub-committee made up of Prof. Mary Anne Lauri (Department of Psychology), Prof. Paul Bartolo (Department of Psychology), Dr Claire Azzopardi Lane (Department of Disability Studies and Deputy Dean) and Dr Clarissa Sammut Scerri (Department of Family Studies) organised a successful 'get to know me' seminar for all our Faculty M.Phil./Ph.D. candidates.

- Dr Kristina Bettenzana (Department of Psychology and Deputy Dean) has presented a report on plagiarism to the College of Heads.

- An **Open Dialogue** was held to discuss 'pro-life' and 'pro-choice' arguments.
- ② An **on-line interview** was held with Daniel Holmes, an event held in collaboration with Lovin Malta.
- Students and staff voted for the **Jacqueline's Social Engagement Award 2021** theme the Faculty should focus on. The chosen theme was 'social justice'.
- Reb Xiberras was nominated by her students' colleagues for the Social Engagement Award and was the winner for this year.
- The lifetime achievement award was given to **Sr Adele Baldacchino** (known as 'il-mama tal-prigunieri') for her incessant support to prisoners.
- The Dean, Prof. Andrew Azzopardi has had **cordial meetings** with the new Commissioner of Police, Mr Angelo Gafa'. He was accompanied by Dr Sandra Scicluna (Head, Department of Criminology), Dr Claire Azzopardi Lane (Deputy Dean) and Ms Charlene Fabri (PA to the Dean)

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- Prof. Marvin Formosa (Department of Gerontology & Dementia Studies) has been elected as Fellow of the **Gerontological Society of America** on the basis that he "has taken a major lead in the education of successive cohorts of gerontologists through his leadership of his home department. He has introduced new postgraduate degrees in ageing and dementia studies as well as re-visioning the focus of his academic location. Prof. Marvin Formosa participated in an international seminar on 'Education and Learning of Older Adults' organised by the Center for Research in Adult Education and Community Intervention, University of Algarve (23rd June 2021).
- On the occasion of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day, which fell on 15th June 2021, Dr Maria Aurora Fenech (Department of Gerontology and Dementia Studies) presented the paper, 'Missing voices: Older persons' insights'. The paper was presented during a webinar organised by the Maltese Association of Geriatrics and Gerontology (MAGG), in collaboration with the International Network for the prevention of Elder Abuse (INPEA). Dr Fenech is an MAGG Council member. She is also INPEA's National Representative. The presentation brought together a project which Dr Fenech coordinated with the students reading for the Higher Diploma in Gerontology and Geriatrics and BA (Hons) in Social Wellbeing Studies. The paper presented older persons' narratives in respect of their experiences related to their breaching of human rights or otherwise during the COVID-19 pandemic.

It is studying the efficacy of the measures provided and the innovative screening measures that are being adopted. This study is being led by UM with the support of the Ministry for Social Justice and Solidarity, the Family and Children's Rights, the Ministry of Health and the Interministerial Task Force responsible for the implementation of the Positive Parenting Strategy.
