Nicos was appointed to the Kennedy Chair at UCL from the beginning of 2004.

combustion engines and his work has contributed to significant progress in a number of areas including: the characterisation of diesel fuels, mixture preparation in spark ignition engines - particularly during transients, the effects of exhaust gas recirculation on diesel engine emissions, understanding and controlling the processes involved in Controlled Auto-Ignition combustion. For this one of his interests lie in lasers. During the mixing of the fuel with air in the internal combustion engine, the researcher must be in a position to know where the fuel is at any given moment and by using laser beams we can create two-dimensional images which show us where the petrol molecules are.

We can, therefore see if the mixing rate of the fuel with air is correct or whether adjustments need to be made.
